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ORDINANCE 2013-94

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING MOBILITY FEES; WAIVING PORTIONS OF CHAPTER 655 (CONCURRENCY AND MOBILITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM), PART 5 (MOBILITY FEE), SECTION 655.503 (MOBILITY FEE REQUIREMENT, CERTIFICATE, APPLICATION PROCESS AND CALCULATION), ORDINANCE CODE TO AUTHORIZE A TEMPORARY PARTIAL WAIVER, CERTAIN UNDER CIRCUMSTANCES, OF MOBILITY FEES FOR 18 MONTHS BEGINNING THREE MONTHS AFTER EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE; REQUIREMENT OF CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY BY DATE CERTAIN; ALLOCATION AO. MOBILITY FEES FOR BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN PROJECTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Policy 1.6.9 of the Capital Improvements Element of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, the City of Jacksonville through the enactment of an ordinance, may establish finite periods of time in which the payment of the mobility fee will be waived for all development within the City in order to encourage economic growth; and

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2011, the City of Jacksonville adopted a waiver on mobility fees, pursuant to Ordinance 2011-617-E; and

WHEREAS, the time period for allowing a waiver on mobility fees expired without sufficient time for such waiver to assist in

encouraging economic growth in the City; and

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whereas, in order to continue to promote and encourage economic growth in the City consistent with Policy 1.6.9 of the Capital Improvements Element of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, it is necessary to establish a new period for a partial waiver of mobility fees in the City; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

(Mobility fee requirement, Section 655.503 Section 1. certificate, application process and calculation) Partially Waived. The provisions of Chapter 655 (Concurrency and Mobility Management (Mobility Fee), Section 655.503 (Mobility fee System), Part 5 requirement, certificate, application process and calculation) which require the payment of the mobility fee prior to approval of final construction and/or engineering plans under Chapter 320, Ordinance Code or building permits for single family residential construction are hereby temporarily partially waived. In all other respects, Section 655.503 (Mobility fee requirement, certificate, application process and calculation) shall remain in full force and effect. The temporary partial waiver will only be applicable to those mobility fees set forth in a mobility fee calculation certificate and will not be applicable to those mobility fees set forth in an expedited mobility fee calculation certificate. The temporary partial waiver on the assessment and collection of any mobility fee required shall remain in effect for a period of 18 months, beginning three months from the effective date of this ordinance, or until such time as repealed by the Council, whichever occurs first. During the temporary partial waiver period beginning three months after the effective date of this ordinance, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in Chapter 655, Ordinance Code, approval of final construction and/or engineering plans under

Chapter 320, Ordinance Code, or building permits for single family residential construction on existing lots obtained within nine months of the effective date of this ordinance shall be required to pay 25% of the mobility fee set forth in a mobility fee calculation certificate, and may thereafter commence construction. temporary partial waiver period beginning three months after the effective date of this ordinance, if a site clearing permit, for property that has received ten set approval per Chapter 654, Ordinance Code, is obtained within nine months of the effective date of this ordinance, any future building permit for single family construction on that property shall be required to pay 25% of the mobility fee set forth in a mobility fee calculation certificate, and may thereafter commence construction. Approval of final construction and/or engineering plans under Chapter 320, Ordinance Code or building permits for single family residential construction on existing lots obtained after nine months after the effective date of this ordinance, but before 15 months after the effective date of this ordinance, shall be required to pay 50% of mobility fee set forth in a mobility fee calculation certificate, and may thereafter commence construction. If a site clearing permit, for property that has received ten set approval per Chapter 654, Ordinance Code, is obtained after nine months after the effective date of this ordinance, but before 15 months after the effective date of this ordinance, any future building permit for single family construction on that property shall be required to pay 50% of the mobility fee set forth in a mobility fee calculation certificate, and may thereafter commence construction. Approval of final construction and/or engineering plans under Chapter 320, Ordinance Code or building permits for single family residential construction on existing lots obtained after 15 months

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after the effective date of this ordinance, but before 21 months after the effective date of this ordinance, shall be required to pay 75% of the mobility fee set forth in a mobility fee calculation certificate, and may thereafter commence construction. If a site clearing permit, for property that has received ten set approval per Chapter 654, Ordinance Code, is obtained after 15 months after the effective date of this ordinance, but before 21 months after the effective date of this ordinance, any future building permit for single family construction on that property shall be required to pay 75% of the mobility fee set forth in a mobility fee calculation certificate, and may thereafter commence construction

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Requirement for Certificate of Occupancy by Section 2. Time Certain. Failure to obtain a Certificate of Occupancy for a single family residential building permit within 42 months after the overall temporary partial waiver period begins shall require immediate payment of that portion of the full amount of mobility fee calculated pursuant to Section 655.503, Ordinance Code but waived during the temporary partial waiver period. Failure to complete construction pursuant to any such final construction and/or engineering plans under Chapter 320, Ordinance Code and obtain a Certificate of Occupancy for: (i) final construction and/or engineering plans or non-single family residential building permits that exceed a value of \$1,000,000.00, no later than thirtysix (36) months after the effective date of this ordinance, or (ii) final construction and/or engineering plans or non-single family residential building permits that have a value of \$1,000,000.00 or less, no later than 12 months after the approval of such final construction and/or engineering plans or non-single family building permits, shall require immediate payment of that portion of the full amount of the mobility fee calculated pursuant to Section

655.503, Ordinance Code but waived during the temporary partial waiver period. In determining the value, the project value may phases of development associated with the construction and/or engineering plans or non-single family residential building permits even if not obtained within the same six month temporary partial waiver rate period or within the overall temporary partial waiver period. However, the mobility fee waiver rate percentage will be determined based upon the temporary partial waiver rate period within which the final construction and/or engineering plans or non-single family residential building permits are obtained.

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Section 3. Allocation of Mobility Fees Collected. Pursuant to Policy 1.4.10 of the Transportation Element of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, a portion of the mobility fee, as calculated by the mobility fee calculation certificate, collected per development is to be allocated for projects identified on the bicycle and pedestrian prioritized transportation mode improvement list within the applicable mobility zone, as found within the Mobility Plan. In order to maintain, the same level of funding for bicycle and pedestrian projects, while allowing for a partial waiver of mobility fees, the Planning and Development Department is directed to allocate, from each mobility fee collected during the temporary partial waiver period, the full amount that would have normally been allocated to the applicable bicycle and pedestrian projects in the absence of any partial waiver, and then allocate any remaining funds to the applicable transportation project in the applicable Mobility Zone.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
