## Jacksonville Public Library (JPL) Rebuilding JPL: Open Hours (\$1M Add) FY 2016 Budget Proposal 8/24/15

The City Finance Committee Budget Hearing #2 Minutes of August 14th contained the following: "Motion (Crescimbeni): budget for \$90 million in state sales tax revenue and allocate the \$1.6 \$1 million above the proposed budget of additional revenue "below the line" in a contingency fund for restoration of library hours - approved unanimously".

In response to various proposals to allocate this additional funding, it was requested that the Library use the \$1 million to fund only additional library hours.

## Rebuilding JPL: (\$1,000,062)

- ✓Adds 88 open hours/week throughout the City at 11 locations, representing a 10.1% increase in open hours
  - 8 hours on Mondays at the 4 Regional Libraries (Highlands\*, Southeast, Pablo Creek, Webb Wesconnett). These added hours result in three (3) nights/week at the Regional Libraries serving all geographic areas of the city.
  - 8 hours on Mondays at Bradham & Brooks, University Park, and Regency Square Branches, which extends service hours strategically in underserved areas in northwest Jacksonville and the Arlington area.
  - 8 hours on Saturdays at all Urban Core Branches: Brentwood, Brown Eastside, Dallas Graham and Westbrook. In addition to Saturdays, open hours at the Brentwood, Brown Eastside, and Westbrook Branches will be revised so that two (2) nights/week at all branch locations across the city.
  - Revise open nights at the West Branch to ensure a complement of morning and evening hours within the Webb Wesconnett Region.
  - Add 11 FTE and part time budget to support the added hours and meet the strategic priority of serving the youth and supporting educational success across Jacksonville.
    - Add (7) Youth Services Librarian I positions
    - (2) Youth Services Librarian II
    - o (2) Adult Librarian II
    - \$245,000 in part time
    - O These staff will enhance the new Duval County Public Schools/JPL Educational Success Partnership which is focused on 60,000 K-5<sup>th</sup> grade students receiving a Student Library Card, as well as visits by all K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade students to the Library and having JPL staff visit all 3rd-5<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms during the 2015-2016 school year.
  - Provide security and custodial services for new hours.
  - Provide supplies and hardware for new hours and staff.
  - Contractual evening shift differentials.

As discussed at the budget hearing, Jacksonville Public Library is requesting additional funding for *Project LEAP* (library enhanced access program) in the amount of \$272,101.32, which could potentially be funded by the Jacksonville Journey budget. The Project LEAP efforts will include working with community partners focused in the Urban Core to enhance and extend services at non-library locations, ensuring deep service connections, collaboration and successful literacy impacts

within the urban core. Some examples of community partners are The Bridge of Northeast Florida, JCC, Fresh Ministries, Boys & Girls Clubs, Impact Halfway House, FSCJ Early Childhood Education Program, Community Connections, the Tony Boselli Foundation and the Police Athletic League.

- The Urban Core has several indicators that require an enhanced service strategy and focus to ensure library use and focused services for quality of life improvement.
  - Violent crime per 1,000 residents is more than double in the Urban Core vs. the county as a whole (10.6 vs. 5).\*\*\*
  - > Average household income is barely more than half of the county as a whole. (\$35,941 vs. \$62,129).\*\*\*
  - > Twice as many adults have never attained a high school diploma compared to the county as a whole (22% vs. 10.8%).\*\*\*
  - > Of the seven (7) traditional elementary schools in this area, five (5) received a "D" or "F" rating.\*\*\*
- Add 5FTE to form the Project LEAP Team to focus on outreach and partnership services which will realize an impact on early literacy, family literacy, and digital literacy efforts focused on educational success and workforce development strategies. Experience has shown that the Library needs to meet people where they are in order to ensure the greatest access, which is especially true for underserved populations.
  - eSpecialist (2)-There is a high need for computer skills training which translates to workforce entry and development training.
  - Literacy Program Specialist- extend the Center for Adult Literacy efforts into the Urban Core to meet Adult Basic Education and literacy needs.
  - Early Childhood Specialist- expand current early literacy efforts within the Urban Core to reach more day care centers, parents, and caregivers.
  - Family Literacy & Outreach Specialist- connect and collaborate with the resources of community organizations, public health organizations, and government services. These external resources, connected and combined with library services, ensure access to quality of life information and services.


- \* In looking at hours changes, usage, and the geographic spread of locations, it has been determined that the Highlands Branch will become a Regional Library in FY16 and the West Regional will become the West Branch. The Highlands Branch already has more open hours and serves north Jacksonville.
- \*\* If the FY16 Budget for the Library includes additional funds to add hours, staff must be hired to extend the hours. There is not current capacity to add hours. Therefore, it is anticipated that any new hours would begin on November 14, 2015.
- \*\*\*The Urban Core statistics are taken from three zip codes: 32206, 32208 and 32209.
- \*\*\*\*There were 1,112 open hours in 2012, and 1,157 open hours in 2008. This restoration of 88 hours supports Rebuilding JPL realizing 956 open hours per week.
