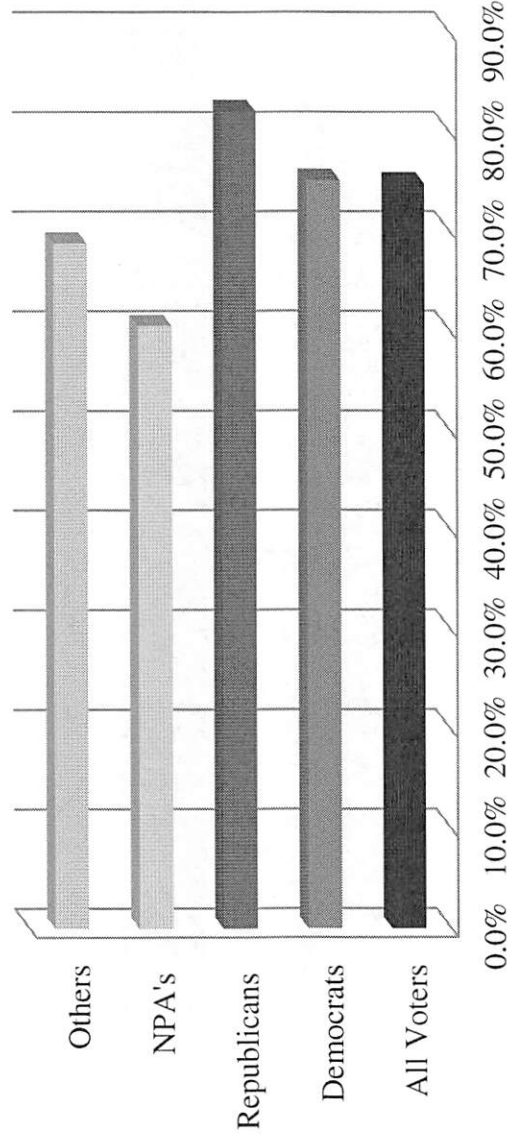

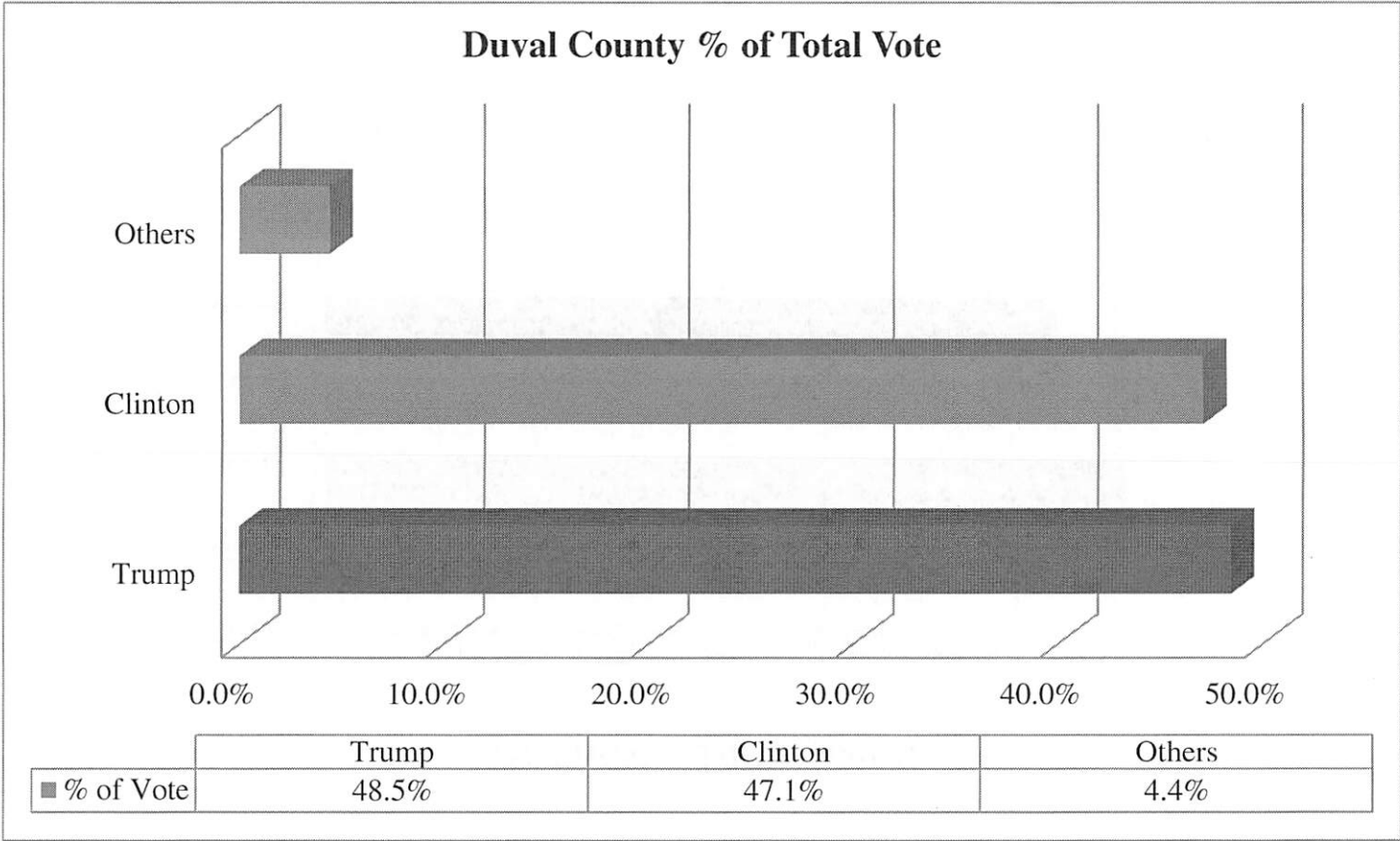

2016 Presidential Turnout %

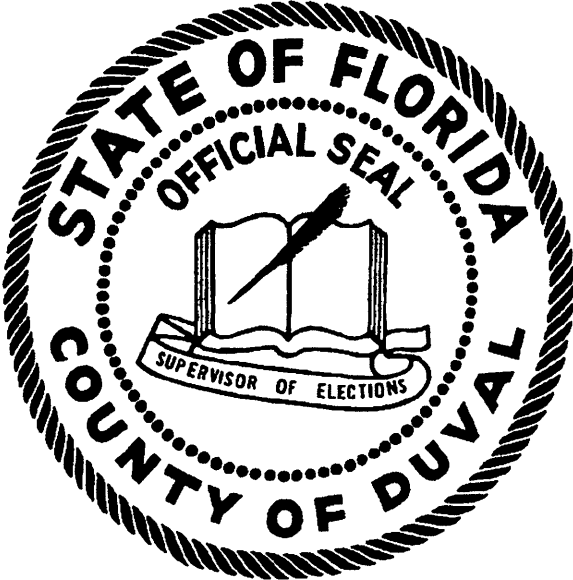

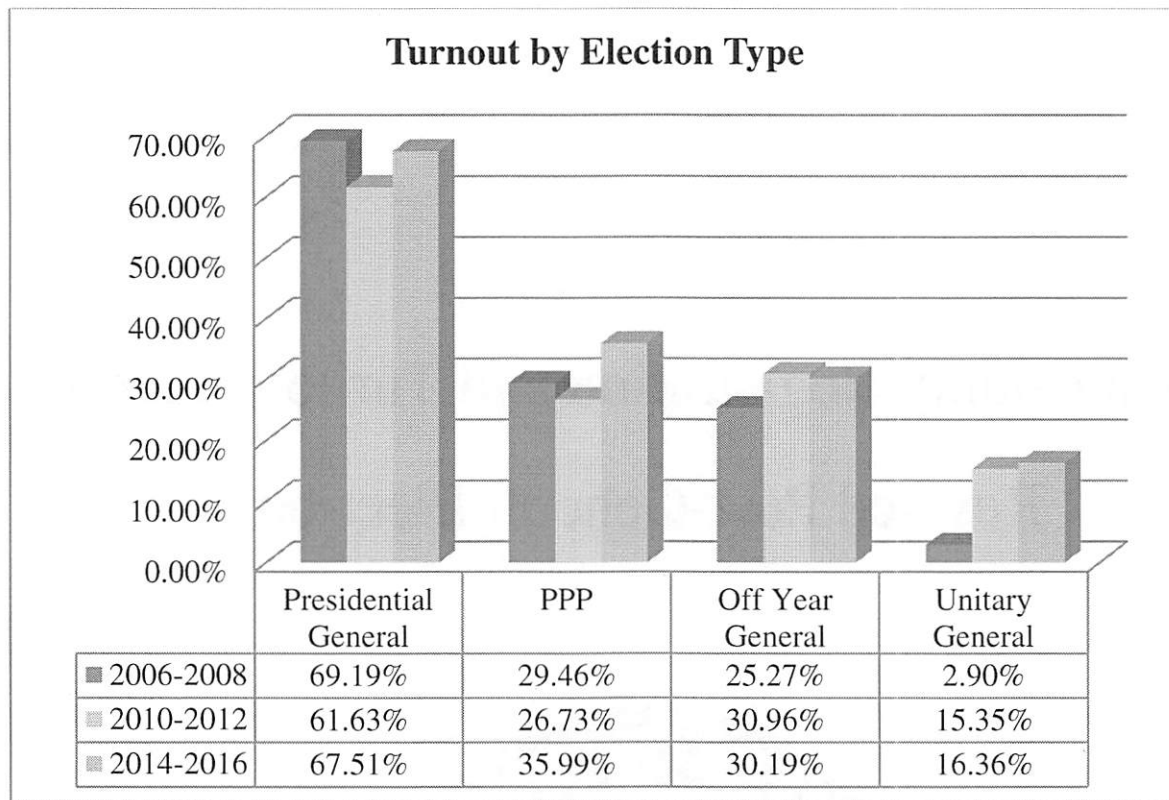

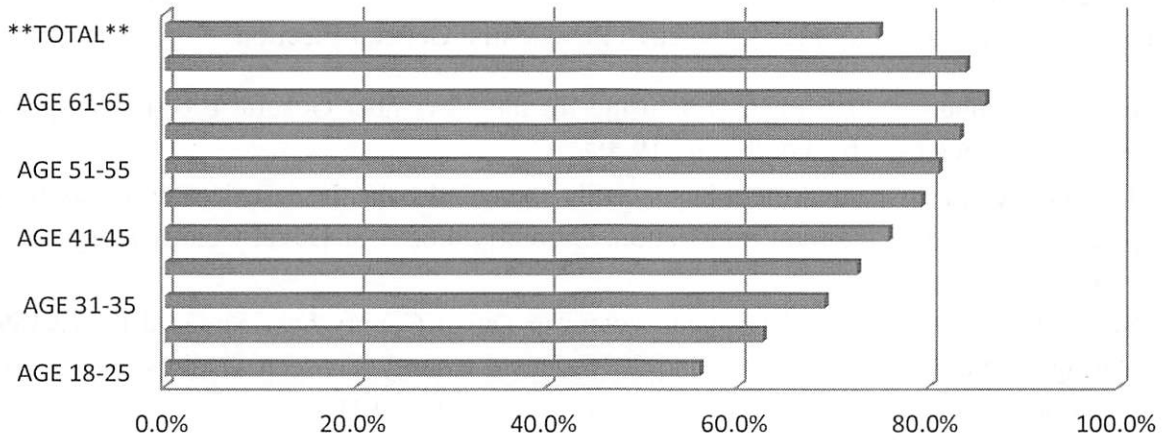
Voter Turnout



When comparing voter turnout between elections it is important to keep in mind that turnout varies by the type of elections being held. Presidential General Elections have the highest turnout in Duval County. General Elections with the office of Governor are generally the second highest in terms of turnout. All voters are eligible to vote in General Elections. Presidential Primaries are usually close behind, but only have candidates from the two major parties on the ballot every eight years because incumbent Presidents rarely draw opposition from their own party. Because Florida is a closed primary state only members of the two major parties are eligible to vote in their respective primaries. The same is true in off year elections for state offices and Congress.

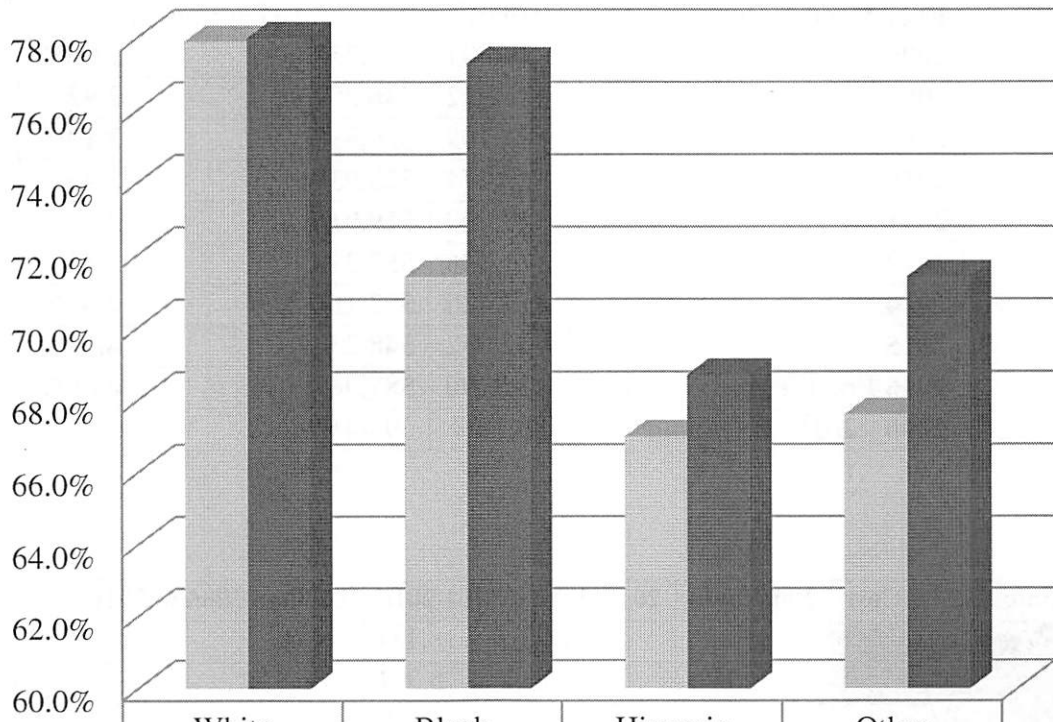

Overview

This short report examines recent Hispanic voter registration and turnout trends in Duval County, Florida. It has been updated to include the 2016 Presidential General Election

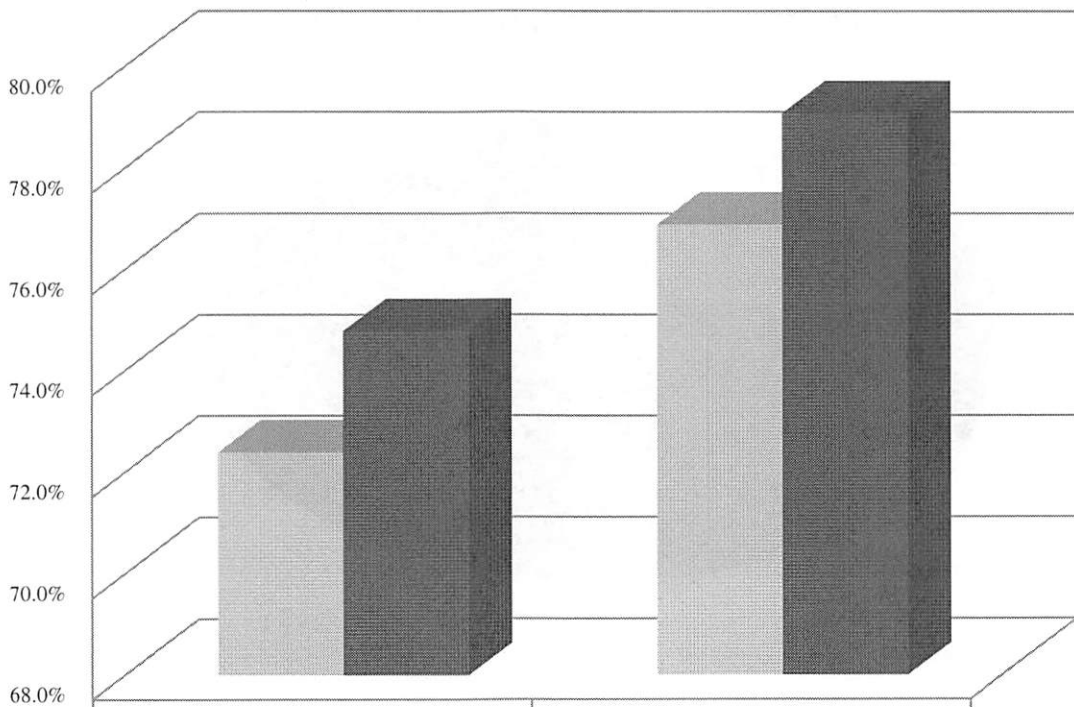
- From December of 2015 to Book Closing for the November General Election Hispanic registration increased by 4.438 or by **19.3%**.
- The number of Hispanic voters has steadily increased over the last decade as has their percentage share of the total registration. Currently 4.66% of Duval County's registered voters are Hispanic.
- Since 2006, the number of Hispanic voters in Duval County has increased by **12,189**. During the period between 2006 and 2016, Duval County has seen a 9.44% increase in registration, while Hispanic registration has increased by **80.19%**.
- The 2008 General Election saw 11,837 Hispanic voters participate or 69.19%. In 2012, 13,093 voted for a 61.63% turnout. There were 18,491 Hispanic voters who participated or 67.51%.
- Between 2006 and 2016, Duval County saw an increase of 50,726 registered voters. 12,189 of the new voters are Hispanic for a **24%** share of the growth in registration.

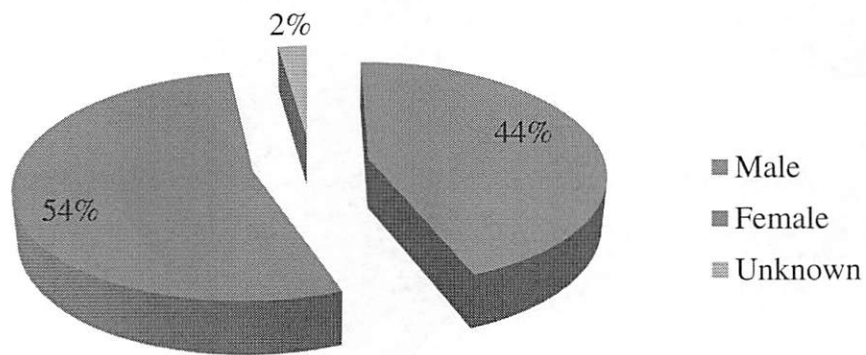

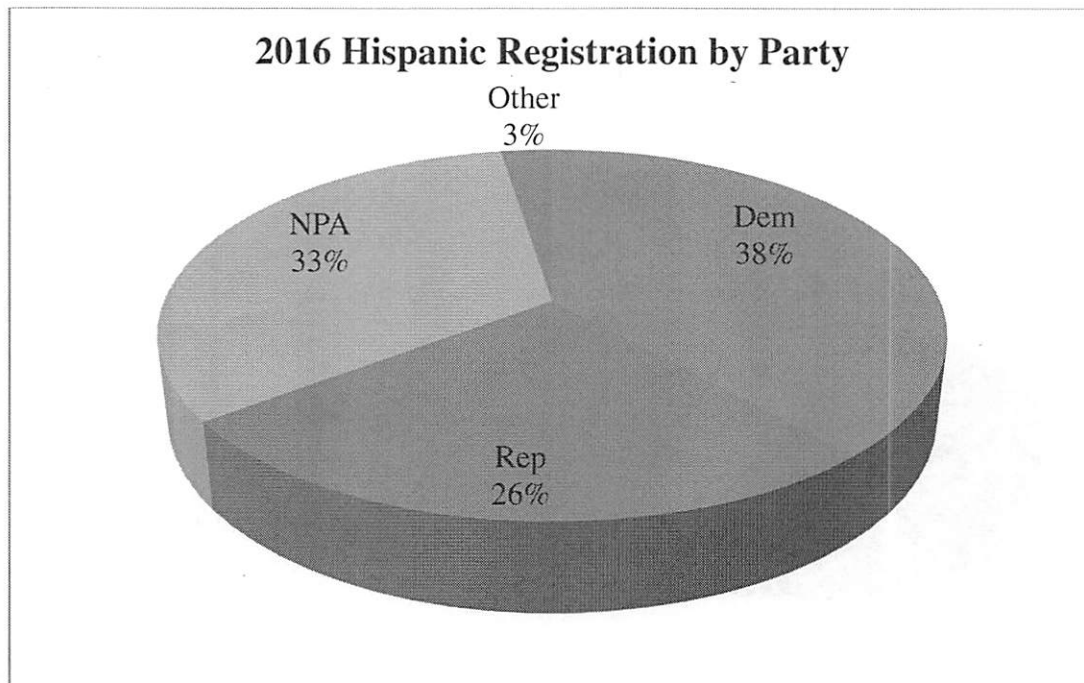
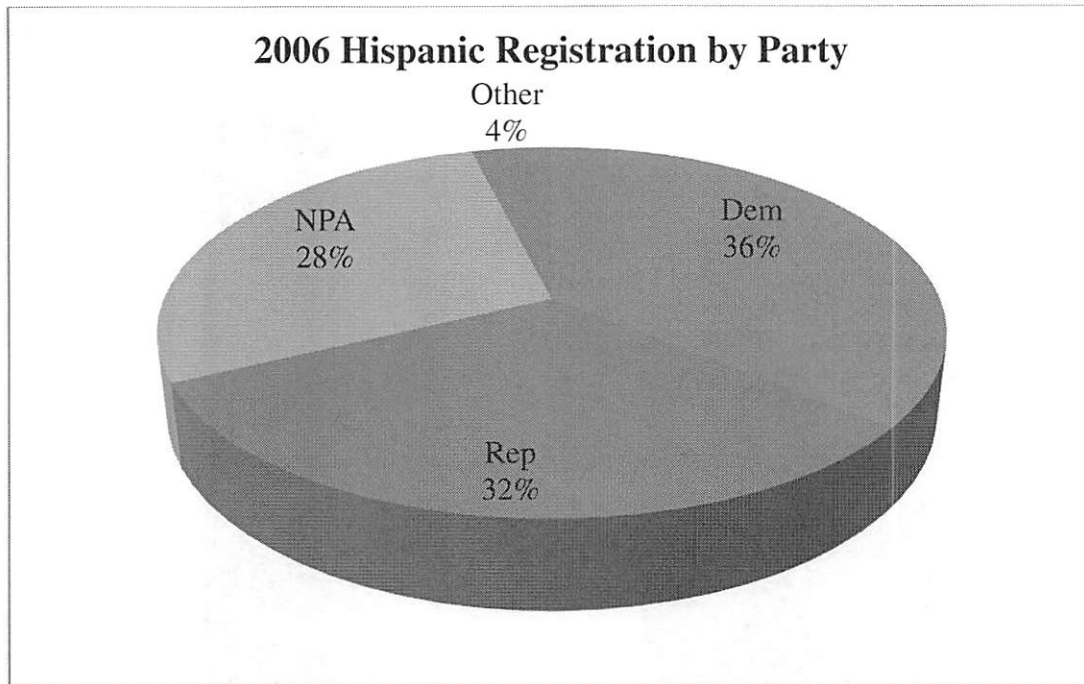

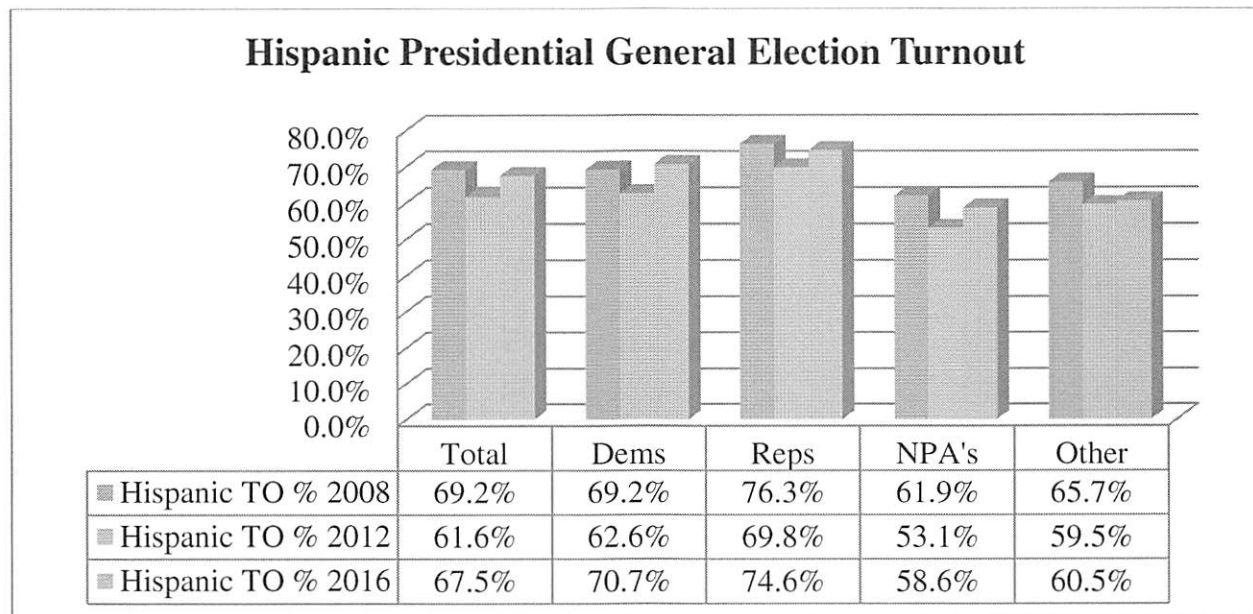
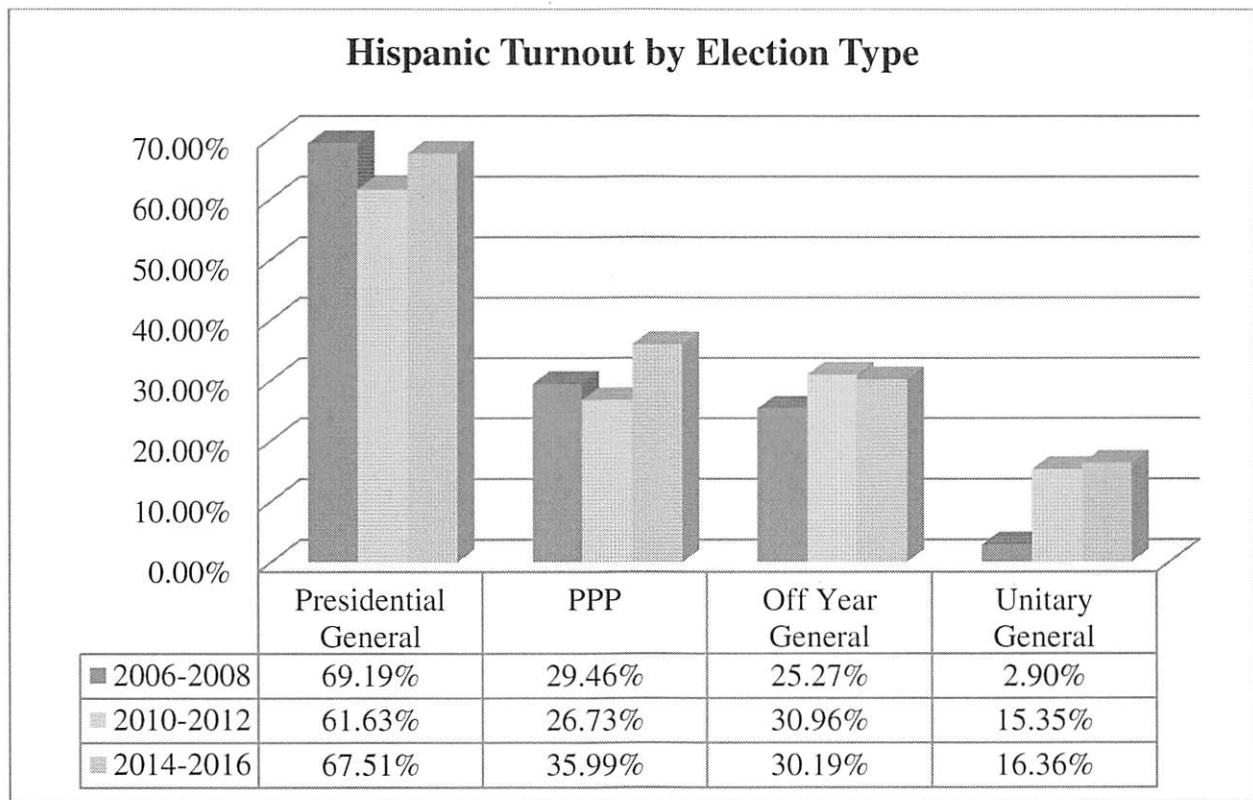


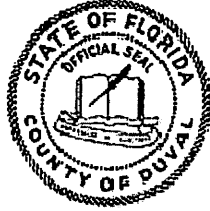
Party Affiliation



The Democratic Party share of the Hispanic registration has increased by 2% since 2006, while the Republican percentage has dropped by 6%. The percentage of those with no party affiliation has risen by 5%.
