# Sec. 59.102 Intent of the Council.

It is the intent of the Council in establishing the Panel to create a body to review the voter registration and the election process, procedures, and experiences in Duval County to advise the Supervisor of Elections in efforts to increase voter registration, enhance voter election experience and assist in candidate education to ensure a fair, impartial and effective election process.—Because of the lessons learned from the November 2000 general election, the

entire voting experience, from voter registration through election day, in all future elections in Duval County, will be conducted in a manner so as to uphold and expand voter confidence in the election system, create a more informed electorate, and increase overall participation in the voting process. In response to the 2000 and 2004 general elections, the Florida Legislature rewrote Florida's elections laws to ensure a consistent and unified election system for use in Florida's 67 counties. This effort standardized many of the election processes each Supervisor of Elections is now required to follow. As such, the initial charge of the Panel is no longer applicable.
