Good morning,

After our conversation on Wednesday, we reached out to the Public Works Department to obtain any priority project listings they had. Below is a synopsis of each project type.

1. Septic Tank projects – Each year a priority listing of Septic Tank Areas is provided by the Public Works Department in coordination with the Florida Department of Health (see attached as Septic Tank Listing 2019-20). In addition, the Public Works Department has a Septic Tank Phase Out Prioritization of projects that they currently work from (see attached as STPO 2019 Priority update). The City is currently in the process of performing the necessary steps to address the first two priority areas. The funding for these two projects came from \$30 million in contributions from JEA, which is supposed to be matched with \$15 million from the City of Jacksonville for a total of \$45 million.
2. Roads – The City prioritizes roadway resurfacing based on six factors. They include:
 - a. Oxidation/raveling
 - b. Cracking
 - c. Cuts/patches/potholes
 - d. Depressions/rutting
 - e. Rideability
 - f. Traffic Volume

Based on these measurement factors, Public Works has compiled the FY 19-20 ReSurfacing List (see attached for identified roadways).

The Jacksonville Transportation Authority is currently constructing road projects that the City transferred to them in 2016. The listing of projects is attached to bill 2016-57-E at the following link -

Public Works also continues to oversee the remaining BJP projects (attached as PW BJP Projects).

3. Sidewalks – There is not a priority listing of sidewalks. They are constructed/repared on somewhat of a first come/first served basis. Public Works will analyze requests for sidewalks (mostly citizen driven) and determine if a sidewalk is needed/in need of repair.
4. Bridges – The Florida Department of Transportation inspects all bridges every two years. They provide the City a listing of the status of bridges that need attention. Public Works will then address the bridges that are in need of repair. Due to the sensitive nature of this information, Public Works does not distribute this listing.

Should you or your committee have questions about the details surrounding how these lists are compiled, how often they get updated, etc., we would recommend contacting Bill Joyce, Operations Director with the Public Works Department (phone number 255-8763). Bill is very knowledgeable about each of these project types.
