RE: Contractor Ex-offender Annual Report FY19

Under the provisions of Section 126.112(f), Ordinance Code, the Chief of Procurement shall provide an annual report to the Mayor and City Council no later than December 31 of each fiscal year for the previous fiscal year on the information provided by Contractors on the Ex-offender compliance report pursuant to Section 126.112. The information below represents the aggregate total of data provided on the compliance reports for the reporting period:
