


Our mission

Local grants: potential models for across the country



Modeling multi-cropping benefits in NE lowa

Iowa's state flood center partnered with a conservation group to model the benefits of having farmers plant a second crop in addition to soy/corn

Funding equitable flood resilience in Texas

A community-based group is holding Harris County accountable for allocating the \$2.5 billion bond money for flood control projects equitably

Creating resilient land use strategies in coastal Virginia

A nonprofit will work with two municipalities to create resilient land use strategies that combine buyouts, conservation, and market-based tools to reduce flood risk and benefit landowners and communities







- Identifies federal funding opportunities that address flooding and sea level rise
- Targeted towards communities with populations of 50,000 or fewer





- Worked with the American Public Health Association
- Draws on case studies and best practices
- Provides six actionable recommendations for proactive planning
