

- What order should we implement?



Update downtown codes and design standards to better define the role of new development in meeting needs for local parks and connectivity.






Play Area





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

Phase I – Existing Conditions Analysis

- Documentation Review
 - Existing reports, studies, and plans
- Demographics and Population
- Analysis of Facilities
 - Inventory/Scoring Matrix
 - Social Equity
 - Social Resiliency





- Future Opportunity Continuous Upgrade Strategy
- Initially developed by PRG & DPRE staff during 2003 Master Recreation Improvement Plan update
- Functions:
 - Identify and prioritize specific capital improvements in parks
 - prioritize renovation of existing parks and development of new parks
- Components:
 - Continuous Upgrade Matrix
 - Future Opportunities Matrix
 - Social Equity Matrix (new for 2022 MRIP Update)
 - Resiliency Matrix (new for 2022 MRIP Update)



Continuous Upgrade Matrix
