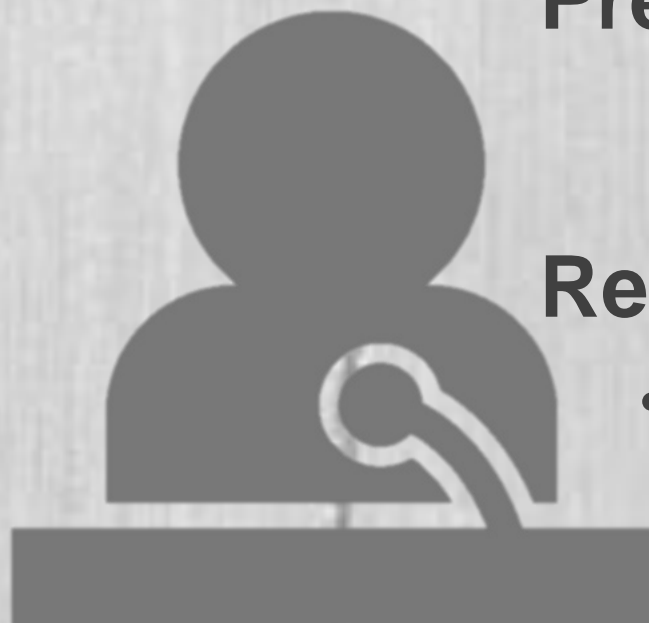

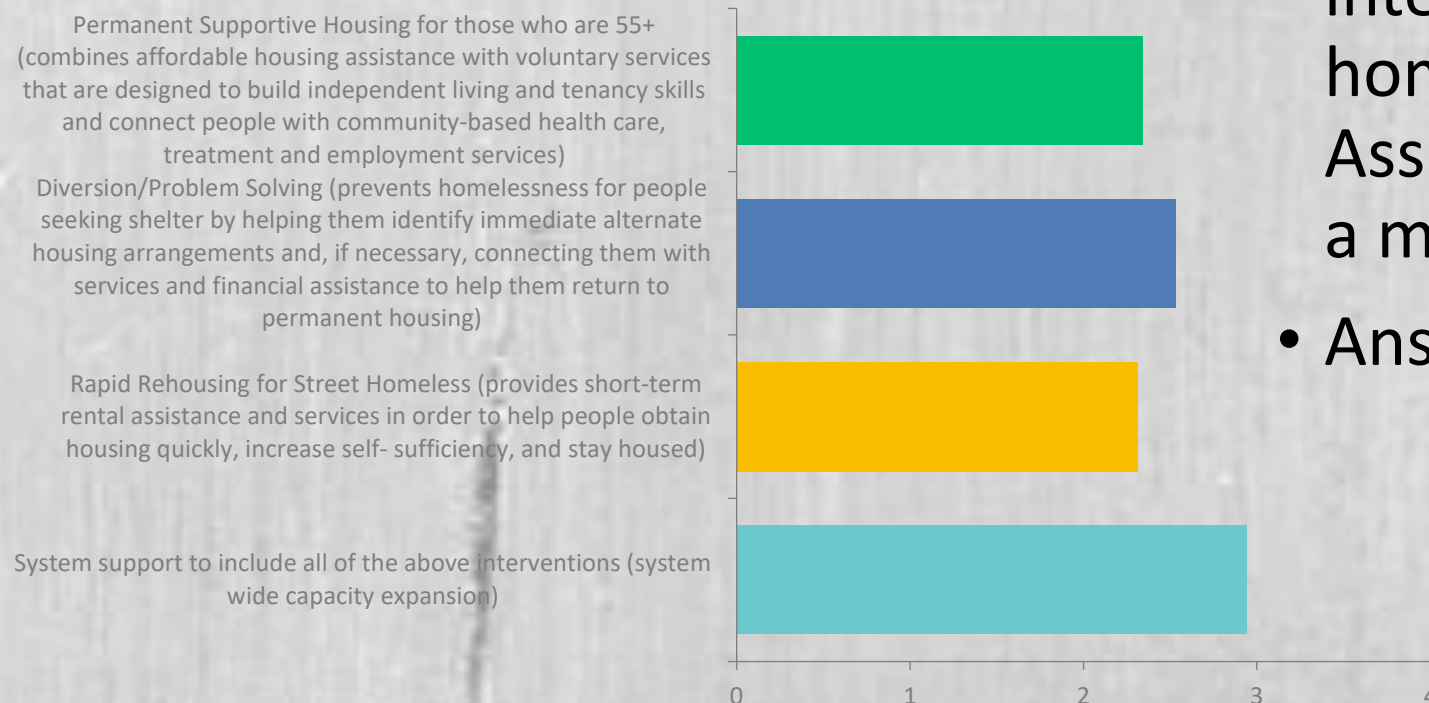

Survey Results

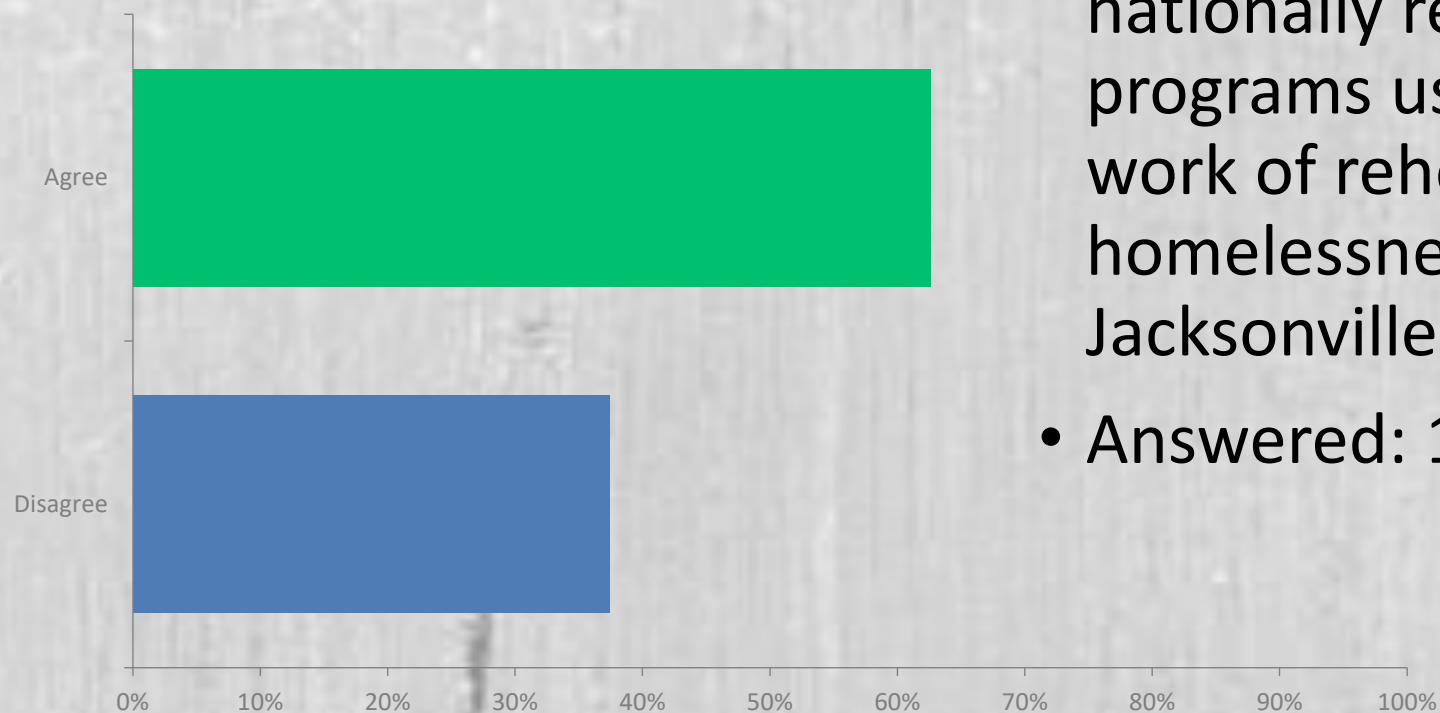
- 109 Total Responses

- SWOT Analysis
 - Eight questions
 - Agree/Disagree
- Recommendations
 - One question with four interventions

What Intervention



- Q1: #1 being the most effective and #4 being the least effective, which intervention would best address homelessness in Jacksonville? Assume this money is coming from a multi year funding source.
- Answered: 106 Skipped: 3

Strength

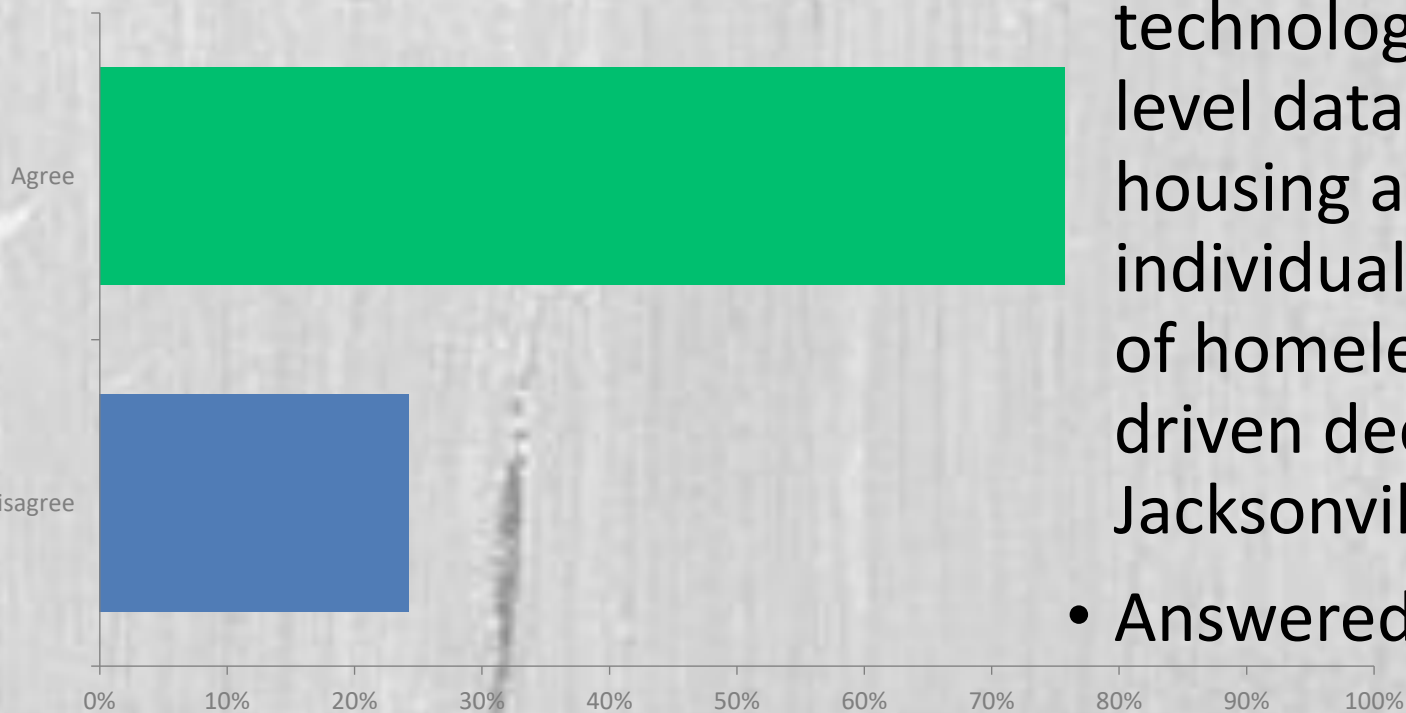

- Answered: 107 Skipped: 2

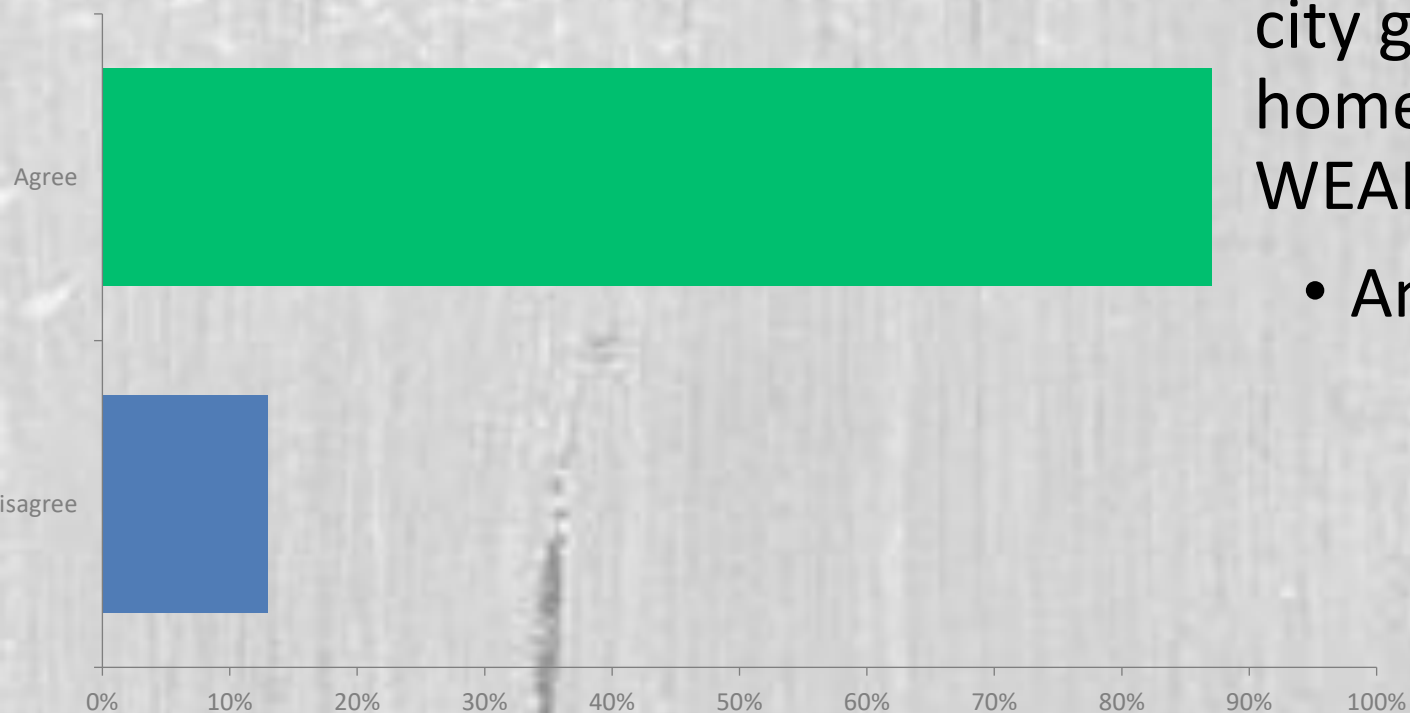
Strength

Weakness



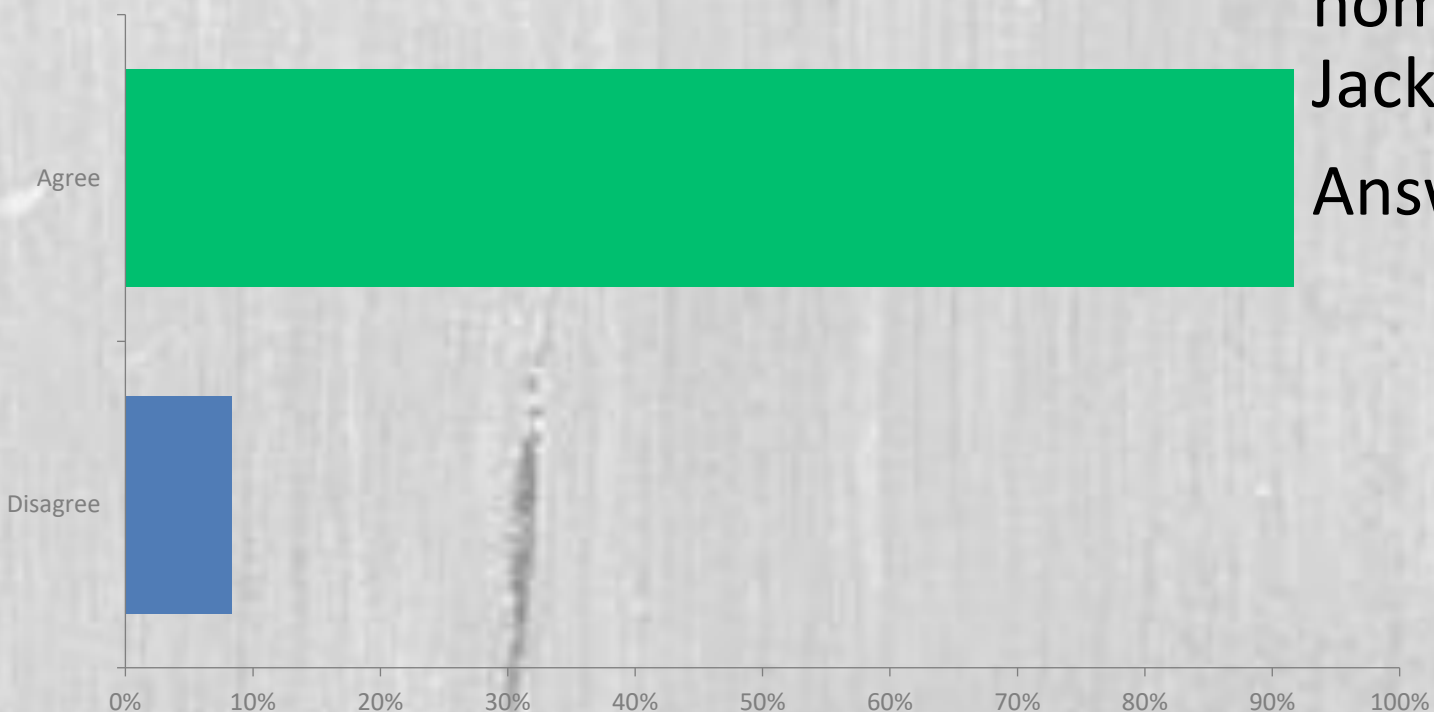
- Q4: Do you agree or disagree that all city grants related to ending homelessness are for a single year is a WEAKNESS in Jacksonville?

- Answered: 108 Skipped: 1

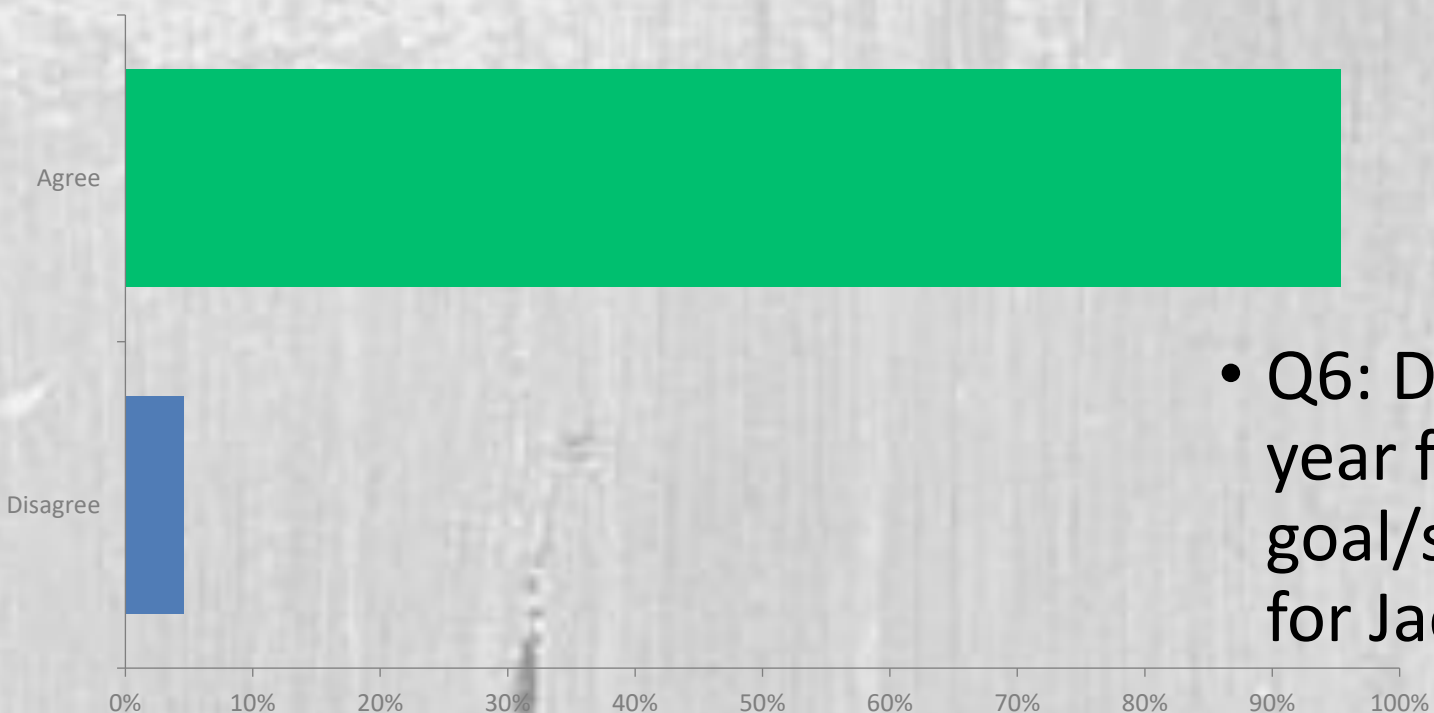
Weakness

Answered: 108 Skipped: 1



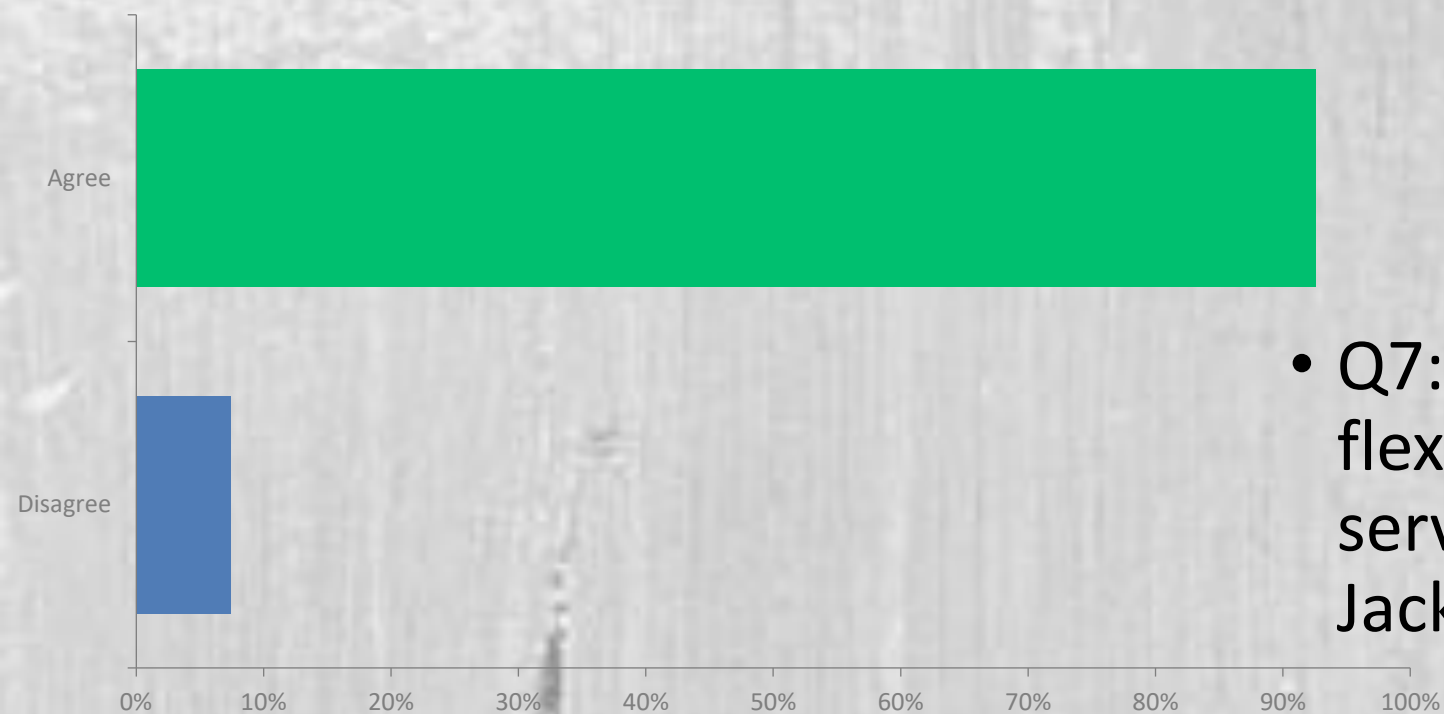
Opportunity

• Answered: 109 Skipped: 0

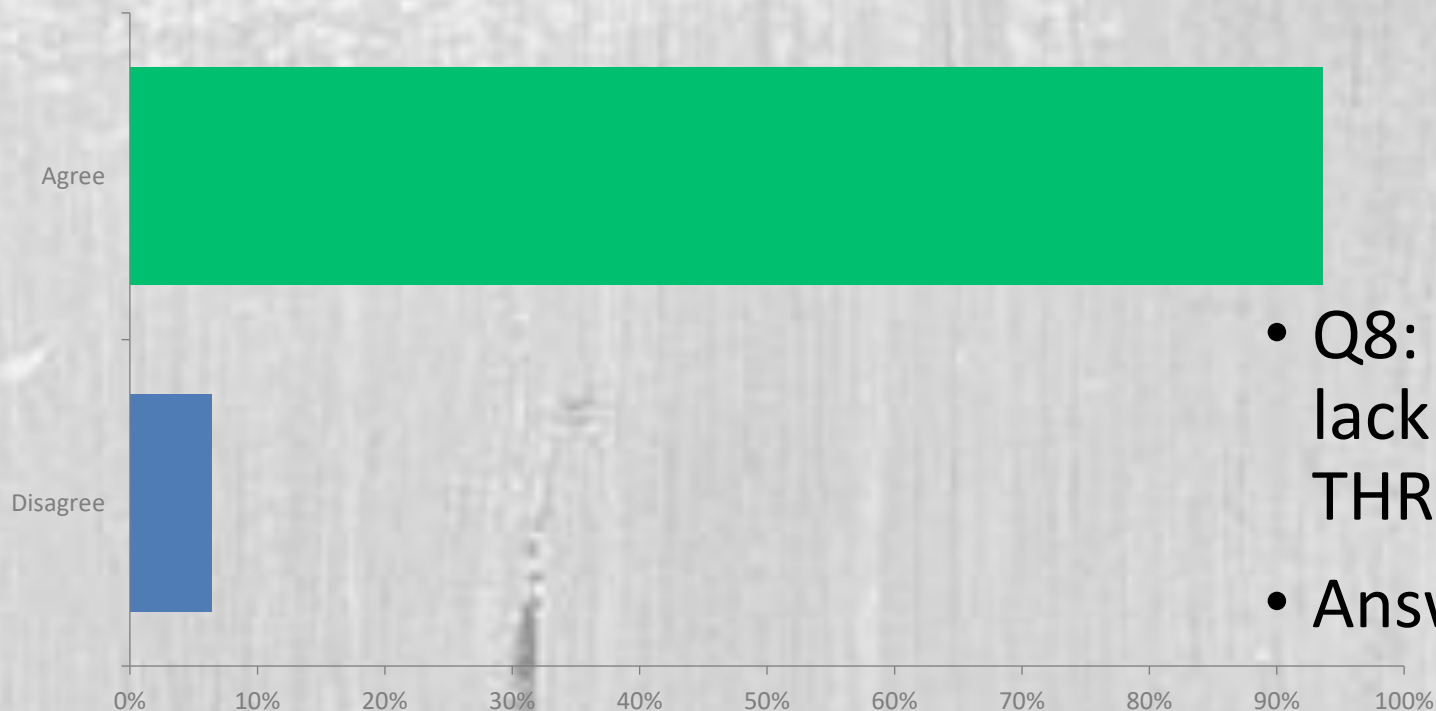
Opportunity



- Q7: Do you agree or disagree that more flexible funding to reduce barriers to services is an OPPORTUNITY for Jacksonville?

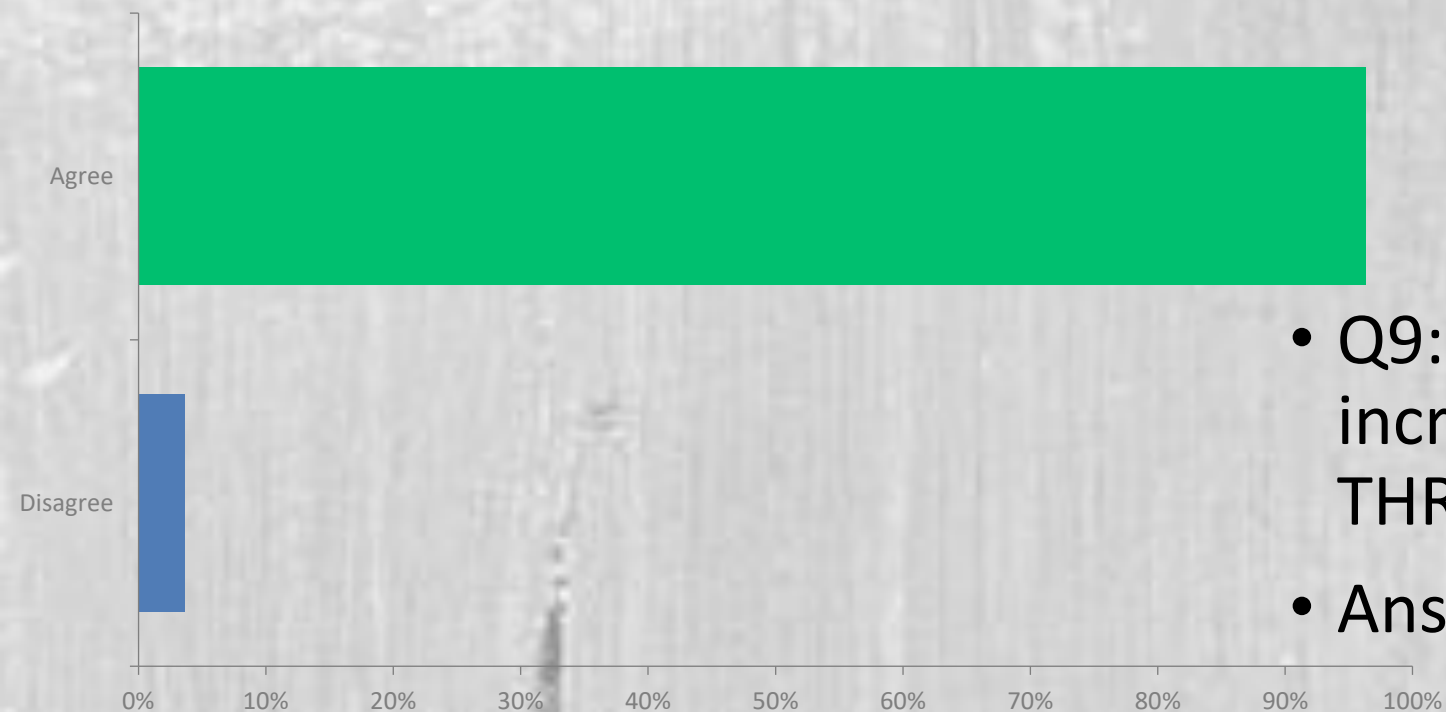
- Answered: 108 Skipped: 1
