4. Presentations

Sunshine Presentation

Rita Mairs, OGC, gave an overview of the Sunshine Law, as related to member to member communications and noticed public meetings. The Sunshine Law applies when two or more individuals on the same board (or council) discuss an issue that may come before their body (this applies to boards and commissions with elected and/or appointed members, including members-elect who have not yet taken office). She explained the requirements for record retention, including text messages. Mr. Fraden asked how long records must be retained. Ms. Mairs said she will report back as to the amount of years records must be saved.

a. Discussion and selection of Find Grant Subcommittee Members

Janet Zimmerman, FIND Assistant Executive Director, gave a presentation about the Florida Inland Navigation District. The Navigation District consists of the twelve counties along the east coast of Florida from Nassau through Miami-Dade County. The Governor appoints a commissioner from each county to serve on the Navigation District's Board of Commissioners. The Board levies a real property tax on all property within the District's boundaries to generate the funds necessary to fulfill the District's responsibilities.

Chair Peluso asked about derelict vessels damaged in storms and hurricanes. Ms. Zimmerman said the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Office of Boating and Waterways maintains a database of known derelict vessels that have been previously been reported or documented by the State.

Brian Burket, Parks Department, explained the timeline for FIND projects and said the new list of applications for this year are being reviewed currently. The JWC members discussed the composition of the FIND subcommittee, which will include: Ms. Haskell, Mr. Fraden, Mr. Hartley, Mr. Barker, Mr. Hoyles and Mr. Birtalan.

5. St. Johns River Status Report on Water Quality & Manatees

Dr. Pinto gave a brief report on the water quality in the river. Chair Peluso asked about causes of algae blooms. Dr. Pinto said blooms are caused a combination of nutrients, heat and rain, impacted by environmental factors like septic runoff, pesticides and wildlife. Dr. Pinto mentioned the symposium at UNF on October 13th, at which this year's State of the River Report will be presented.

Additionally it would be difficult for staff to attend for the required taking of minutes and recording/taping the meeting.

7. New Business

Discussion and Selection of St. Johns River Accord Subcommittee

CM Peluso talked about the St. Johns River Accord signed in 2006 by state and local government agencies (City Hall, JEA, the St. Johns River Water Management District and state Department of Environmental Protection) marking a 10-year commitment to spend \$700 million improving the health of the St. Johns River in this part of the state. The Accord committed to reduce the amount of nitrogen discharged into the river by: phasing out older technology wastewater treatment plants; improving other wastewater treatment plants and build expand re-use of treated wastewater for irrigation of lawns, parks, and golf courses; eliminating failing septic tanks; capturing and treating stormwater before it enters the river. CM Peluso said he would like to consider a new iteration of the Accord and identify what has been achieved and what is left to be done. The composition of the River Accord subcommittee will be: CM Peluso, Mr. Barker, Mr. Hartley and Mr. Hoyles.

Susan Grandin, OGC, explained the bill which amends Ordinance Code Chapter 652 – Floodplain Management – to incorporate recommendations from the Florida State Floodplain Management Office regarding agricultural and accessory structures, needed for the City to maintain its current ratings with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and to update the effective dates of the flood insurance rate maps.
