Dear District-5 Councilman Carlucci:

Thank you for the opportunity to propose the following landscape project for the San Marco Square and islands. This is a very exciting project and believe will inspire other areas in Jacksonville to upgrade their landscape.

Observations

- The existing landscape is in poor and declining condition.
- The islands have been overplanted with too many coontie palms and need removal. These also pose a health risk with rodents living in these beds.
- Visibility is a challenge in certain areas and needs to be addressed.
- The current plants do not provide an attractive display for an area that has many special events and wedding ceremonies.
- The condition of the grass on the square is poor and may need to be replaced.

Action Plan

- Locate all utilities prior to starting and flag irrigation.
- Remove and dispose all coontie palms, African iris, crinum lilies and any undesirable plants including sod. Clean out beds.
- Test and modify irrigation. Note: Irrigation may determine the type of plant materials used in the renovation.
- Add organic soil mix in all beds and grade.
- Design and install a professional landscape that the merchants and visitors can enjoy for many years. Using colorful hardy plants will add impact and attract visitors to the area.
- Submit a proposal with some design options to consider.
- Utilize the existing Asiatic jasmine and liriope if desired. Note: the tree wells currently have liriope planted and are doing well.
- Determine the level of maintenance on these areas before starting a design.
- While working on the islands, it may be necessary to reroute traffic and may need temporary staging area for debris removal.
- Propose a plan for LED lighting for safety and uplighting in the beautiful trees in Balis Park.

MHRC is proposing to establish a behavioral health outreach program in the District 9 City Council area to increase access to behavioral health services. The program will serve all individuals in need, regardless of ability to pay utilizing a sliding fee schedule (inability to pay will not result in denial of services). Behavioral health services in this areas has been identified as a need by constituents residing in the district and is deemed an underserved area.

The Outreach Program will consist of:

1 FTE Care Coordinator – This position will provide walk-in assessments and care coordination services three days a week/four hours a day to screen and assess individuals in need of behavioral health services. This program will be piloted for a year and evaluated to determine utilization.

Shared costs:

- MHRC currently has a SAMHSA Grant that will allow for the payment of the APRN through June 30, 2023.
- A total of \$73,160.52 will be needed to fund the full-time care coordinator.

	The Fire Watch Council is a multi-jurisdictional government entity formed in October 2019 by Baker, Clay, Nassau, and St Johns Counties and COJ (the "5 Counties") to lead regional efforts to reduce veteran suicide. Over 6,000 U.S. military veterans have died by suicide each year since 2008, including more than 500 annually in Florida. The 5 Counties are home to 1,500,000 residents and 160,000 military veterans. In 2019, the 5 Counties lost 78 veterans to suicide, which was the highest annual count recorded. The rate of veteran suicides in 2019 was 45 of 100,000. This is 2 times the rate of civilian suicides in our region. The Fire Watch Council first convened in December 2019. The 5 Counties
	assigned COJ as the entity's Administrator. In February, it hosted public meetings to gather feedback as its Strategic Plan. In March 2020, it launched that plan. All under COJ supervision.
	Based on the CDC's Suicide Prevention Logic Model, the Fire Watch Council has implemented multiple veteran suicide prevention programs in Northeast Florida. Our cornerstone initiative is the Watch Stander Program. It was launched in May of 2020 and is an upstream, on-line and in-person, early intervention network of community volunteers trained to identify risk factors of veterans in crisis and to direct those veterans to the resources they require, including the Veteran Crisis Line, 211 or our Veteran Resources Guide.
	The program is available for free on our website. Training takes just 30-45 minutes. Modeled after CPR, our Watch Stander program is the first of its kind in the country. To date we have trained 4598 Watch Standers.
	Our goal is to reduce veteran suicides in Northeast Florida by 25% over 3 years against baseline 2019 data. We have 2 years of applicable veteran suicide data thus far. In 2021, there were 42 veteran suicides in Northeast Florida. This is a 46% reduction from the 2019 baseline. The rest of the State of Florida experienced a 4% reduction over this same period.

Specific areas of concern in this facility include: removing a raised section of the floor in the multipurpose room, (the building was previously an elementary school and part of this room's floor was constructed as a stage), adding push button automatic door openers to 5 doors (the front entrance and 4 bathrooms). These changes would allow individuals the dignity of being as self-sufficient and independent as possible.

	The Essential Angels Program is a referral-based care package distribution system that provides clothing, hygiene items, and more to students in grades Pre-K through 12 who are experiencing homelessness and/or persistent or situational poverty. Teachers, social workers, and other service agencies identify students in need and refer them to the program through our online portal.
	GCP staff assembles and discreetly distributes customized care packages with a week's worth of clothing, shoes, hygiene products, and school supplies. This allows for discreet delivery of services, eliminates transportation barriers to service, functions as part of a coalition of nonprofit partners working to clothe our most vulnerable youth, reduce chronic absenteeism, and bolster students' dignity and self-esteem in alignment with the county's Youth Master Plan. Recurring services are always available. GCP also installs on-site, stocked closets at schools with

significant numbers of student in need, allowing for immediate delivery of services.

The Essential Angels Program also leverages existing pathways to connect students with services throughout the school year. Because not all students in need are linked to social service providers, school faculty play a vital role in the Essential Angels referral system. They observe, identify, and refer students who may otherwise fall through the cracks allowing GCP to serve the broadest need as possible. Care packages are delivered within one week of receiving referral.

The Essential Angels Program operates out of GCP's hub and distribution center located at Martin Luther King Jr. Elementary School. This on-site presence allows administrators, faculty, and staff to address immediate clothing, hygiene, or school supply needs of the students attending this school, in addition to the online referrals that are filled at this location on any given school day.

Care Packages are valued at \$150 per student and include:

- 3 5 outfits (shirt/shorts/pants)
- 3 5 pairs of new socks
- 3 pairs of new underwear
- 1-2 pairs of shoes (1 pair of sneakers, and 1 other type of shoe: dress shoe, sandals, etc.)
- One Month of hygiene supplies including deodorant, shampoo/conditioner, soap, feminine products.

Duval County Public Schools teacher Jennifer Smith founded The Giving Closet Project in April 2016. After spending 15 years in the public school system, Smith recognized that student access to clean clothing, shoes, and hygiene items was uneven across the student population. Students lacking consistent access

But they need to be maintained and beautified.
	Several years ago, the City of Jacksonville embarked on a large capital project to restore these cemetaries, clearing brush, creating access, and fixing and restoring tombstones. This has progressed well. However, there is currently no additional funding in the CIP for beaufitication of these four cemetaries.
