DATE: April 29, 2020

- I. <u>Document protocol.</u> A protocol has been developed by Smith, Hulsey and Busey (SHB) for the transmission and review of documents and the protocol has been circulated to all council members electronically. OGC is currently culling through the documents to provide non privileged documents to SHB by the beginning of May. SHB anticipates having targeted documents for the Special Investigatory Committee's review by the end of May.
- II. <u>Witness Interviews.</u> The Special Investigatory Committee asked Steve Busey to interview Lynne Rhode, Stephanie Burch, Randall Barnes, Robin Smith, Joseph Ofano, and Melissa Dykes, inviting them first to appear voluntarily to testify under oath. A copy of the April 21, 2020 Special Investigatory Committee agenda meeting minutes is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**. Before her termination, Melissa Dykes had indicated through her attorney, Hank Coxe, that she was available to voluntarily be interviewed by SHB under oath. Lynne Rhode has indicated through her attorney, Rut Liles, that she is available to testify with SHB under certain conditions, including no further appearances. Stephanie Burch's interview is being coordinated through her attorney, Warren Lindsey.
- III. <u>JEA continues to produce documents.</u> Attached hereto are documents responsive to the several requests for production that are immediately available to the Special Investigatory Committee for review. In excess of 500 emails from Alan Howard was produced the week of April 20. A list of the available documents is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**.

- IV. <u>Subpoena for documents to the Bidders and the Banks.</u> On April 21, 2020, Subpoenas were issued to all the ITN bidders and two financial institutions, to produce documents or in alternative to appear at the May 18 Special Investigatory Committee meeting. Specifically the subpoenas asked for i.) a list of all a copy of all lobbyist, attorneys and consultants employed by the Company; and ii.) any documents showing that the company was or was not given an opportunity to physically inspect JEA assets at any time after January 1, 2018. Of the 22 subpoenas issued, 16 have been served. To date there have been three responses:
 - a. Argo Infrastructure partners responded that the company employed no lobbyist, attorney or consultant in conjunction with ITN, and that they did not communicate with JEA to have a physical inspection of JEA assets, nor did they have a physical inspection of JEA assets.
 - b. Duke Energy responded that they employed the following attorneys and consultants: Shutts & Bowen LLP (Attorneys); Hunton Andrews & Kurth LLP (Attorneys); Citigroup Global Markets Inc (consultants); PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP (consultants); Willis Towers Watson PLC (consultants); No lobbyists were employed. Duke Energy provided one document regarding physical inspections which indoicates that physical inspections would take place the week of January 20, 2020.
 - c. Hargray Communications Group Inc. provided several documents which appears to be documents received by Hargray from JEA including ITN 127-19 Addendum #4 with the related attachments.
 - d. Veolia Water North America South, LLC responded that the company does not have any records for the information requested in the subpoena.

The Special Investigatory Committee on JEA Matters subpoena log is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**.

V. Options. On April 21, 2020, JEA was served with a Federal Grand Jury Subpoena requesting 50 enumerated areas of documents. A copy of the Subpoena is attached hereto as Exhibit 3. Many of the requested documents overlap with the Special Investigatory Committee's 84 request for production. Based on the service of the Federal Grand Jury Subpoena, OGC and SHB has provided three options to the Special Investigatory Committee in light of the issuance Federal Grand Jury Subpoena: 1. Make no change to the Special Investigatory Committee actions and charge; 2. Pause the Special Investigatory Committee while the Federal Grand Jury process is underway, so as to avoid any possible interference with the Federal process; 3. Continue with the scope of the request for documents and witness interviews as voted upon by the Special Investigatory Committee prior to the Federal Grand Jury subpoena issuance, while attempting to avoid impeding the federal

investigation. The Office of General Counsel cautioned and counselled the Special Investigatory Committee with respect to avoiding any even indirect interference with regard to the Federal investigation.

Meeting Convened: 1:04 p.m.

Chairman Diamond convened the meeting and the attendees were introduced for the record.

Mr. Diamond reported that an agreement was struck yesterday among attorneys for JEA Interim CEO Melissa Dykes and City attorneys regarding Ms. Dykes voluntarily testifying under oath at a meeting in May. Because of the time consuming process of getting subpoenas through the Rules Committee, he wants to have the committee approve a subpoena for Ms. Dykes to hold in reserve for use if necessary if her voluntary appearance does not take place in a timely manner. Council Member Wilson asked how the subpoena would be worded. Mr. Diamond said it would require Ms. Dykes to appear in a suitable place for up to 8 hours of testimony before the Investigatory Committee. Council Members Priestly Jackson and Wilson said they would prefer to hold off on approving a subpoena since she's agreed to appear. Deputy General Counsel Peggy Sidman said that two versions of a subpoena have been prepared – one to compel Ms. Dykes' appearance before the committee at a meeting in May, the other to have give her the option of being deposed by Steve Busey of Smith, Hulsey and Busey and compelling her appearance before the committee if such a deposition does not take place. The committee divided two to two on

immediately issuing a subpoena. Mr. Busey was asked to communicate with Ms. Dykes' attorney and get a commitment for a definite appearance date.

Chairman Diamond reviewed the history of the committee's 84-point document request to JEA and the authority's hiring of a law firm to facilitate the review of those documents to ensure the non-disclosure of anything that can't be disclosed (privileged and exempt items). General Counsel Jason Gabriel explained that a protocol has been developed by Smith, Hulsey and Busey for the transmission and review of those documents and that protocol has been circulated to all council members electronically. The timeline is aggressive but reasonable, with Smith, Hulsey and Busey having access to all the documents for review by the end of next week. Chris Garrett of the General Counsel's Office explained the need to review all the documentation for exempt and privileged items before release, and said that they will be available to Smith, Hulsey and Busey for search by May 1st, with access by the special committee coming thereafter once identified documents of interest have been verified for release. Mr. Busey expected that the committee would begin receiving documents by the end of May. Cheryl Brown reported that the Council Secretary's Office has not been a party to this document subpoena request and suggested that the Office of General Counsel be the custodian of the documents received until such time as they are released to the committee and become public records, at which point they will be posted for public access by the City Council staff.

Council Member Salem asked that council members who are not members of the Special Investigatory Committee be given copies of the documents that the committee members received. Chairman Diamond asked that Smith, Hulsey copy the Council Secretary on any communications and document shares to the committee.

Mr. Diamond asked Mr. Busey to describe an April 14 memorandum he developed regarding the interviewing of selected current and former City and JEA employees with regard to their review of the JEA recapitalization Invitation to Negotiate (ITN) responses. Several committee members agreed that members of the City administration who were involved in the review process need to be interviewed. The Chairman said he will extend invitations to those people to voluntarily come and testify under oath with the special counsel or Office of General Counsel before resorting to subpoenas. The committee asked that special counsel Busey perform the interviews. Council Member Salem asked the committee to have Mr. Busey pose questions to those interviewees about the ITN; he understood that the General Counsel's earlier inquiries of those members dealt more with matters relating to the discharge of former JEA CEO Aaron Zahn than with the ITN.

Motion (DeFoor): the special committee asks Steve Busey to depose Lynn Rhode, Stephanie Burch, Randall Barnes, Robin Smith, Joseph Ofano, and Melissa Dykes, inviting them first to appear voluntarily to testify under oath – **approved 4-0.**

President Wilson said that expenditures on the special counsel are approaching the \$500,000 initial limit. If anyone has questions, please pose them to Steve Busey or Peggy Sidman. Ms. Sidman said that the not-to-exceed limit is \$480,000 and about \$300,000 has been billed through the month of February. She understands that Smith Hulsey may need additional funding for a computer platform to make documents available to the City Council. Mr. Busey said that an agreement reached last week with JEA's document review attorney makes an additional platform unnecessary, so there will be no need for that additional expenditure in that regard. Council Member Priestly Jackson asked Mr. Busey to provide the committee with an estimate of the cost of doing the 6 additional interviews requested by the committee today.
