Annual Fee Update and Analysis

The Finance and Administration Department has reviewed fees charged by City departments for providing direct services to the public as requested during the Council Finance Committee proposed 2020/21 budget hearings. The scope of this review is the list of City fees presented for public reference via https://www.coi.net/departments/finance/city-fees.aspx pursuant to Municipal Code §123.102. Due to pandemic effects, activity levels for the fiscal years 2017/18 and 2018/19 were considered in most of the review, rather than 2019/20.

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This process is governed by Municipal Code §106.112 which was recently amended by Ordinance 2020-557-E to require fee changes to be accomplished through legislation.

Reviews of the following four enterprises were performed for October 1, 2020, as requested by the Finance Committee, and subsequently discussed with the Chairs of the Finance and TEU Committees.

Storm Water Utility Motor Vehicle Inspection Building Inspection Solid Waste Disposal

The accompanying analysis of fees has been performed to update policy makers on the current levels of fees and the general health of the funds and operations that those fees support. Unlike the enterprise funds, which are designed to operate in a business-like manner and remain largely self-supportive, many of the fees in this analysis are generally designed to offset costs or control access to a certain type of governmental service or offering. This analysis is therefore not designed to present conclusions that individual fees should be increased or decreased but is instead designed to provide the reader with an overview of fees for varying services provided by the government.

The costs of many services cannot be identified with a reasonable degree of precision for pricing decisions due to variability in the delivery of services, such as the number of participants per instance, differing facility resources, staffing levels, and capital requirements. The most precision occurs within enterprise funds which can measure total revenues against total costs.

Though not formally defined, the City charges three general categories of fees for services.

Enterprise – covering all the costs of a unit of operations like the private sector.
 Services provided are discretionary or the service provided has a market value, such as Public Parking and residential solid waste collection. Information is presented regarding

the overall sufficiency of enterprise fees via fund wide comparisons of revenue and costs.

- 2. Regulatory generally recoup variable costs and a portion of fixed costs for services that benefit the public with demand driven by users or applicants. The fees are not intended to cover all costs but are in place to recover the incremental costs of regulatory functions. Most City fees are in this category and have evolved over the years to cover varying levels of cost and demand for services. Many of the fixed costs of these functions are not charged separately, recognizing the provision of these functions serve the citizens by providing oversight or control over activities that affect quality of life, public safety, or provision of services. We are not recommending changes in these fees due to the lack of a requirement to recover all costs or formal definition of what costs are to be recovered.
- 3. <u>Controlled Access</u> charge levied for a discretionary service to govern demand while recovering a portion of costs, comparable to other local governments, such as recreational facility usage. These fees appear to be accomplishing their intent by controlling the level of public access to finite resources and recovering a portion of costs.

This review includes the following departments and agencies that charge fees referenced on the City's website pursuant to Municipal Code §123.102, including the Enterprise funds reviewed for the discussions shortly after October 1, 2020.

Construction Trades Qualifying Board

 Regulatory fees are levied on a two-year licensing cycle and recoup approximately 72 percent of expenditures.

Downtown Investment Authority

- There are a few controlled access charges which are nominal fees to encourage ideas while managing submissions.
- Public Parking Enterprise Off street garage rates and meter rates were recently raised administratively pursuant to Municipal Code §122.202 and §802.107. Other parking fees are also under review per the 2019 parking study.
 Enterprise revenues fell approximately \$300,000 short of expenditures during the pandemic challenged FY 2019/20.

Economic Development

Regulatory fees for the review of bond issuance applications are covering costs.

Finance and Administration Department

• The Motor Vehicle Inspection Enterprise was found to cover its expenditures in the October 1 review.

Fire and Rescue Department

- Ambulance service fees are established in conjunction with Federal reimbursement guidelines. Gross billings total approximately 83% of total rescue expenditures, net revenue is approximately 38% of expenditures. Revenues are reduced by Medicaid and Medicare limitations, bad debts, and insurance contracts.
- Regulatory fees generally cover a portion of service cost.
 - Fees for rescue and fire report copies are less than 30% of costs. They are nominal amounts of \$3 and \$5. The total cost of providing the service is approximately \$17.95.
 - The Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity fees are \$2,000 and \$1,000.
 The direct cost of providing the review is approximately \$200, however considerable rescue knowledge is necessary to perform the reviews.
 - o Fire Inspection Safety Inspection Fees cover approximately 52% of total costs. This service is an important public safety function.
- The Building Inspection Fund, which includes Fire & Rescue and Planning &
 Development inspections was found to cover its expenditures in the October 1 review.
 The Legislature recently enacted new building inspection timelines which may affect future service delivery. The Council's Special Committee on Assessing the City's Building and Development Permitting Processes is reviewing this function.

Neighborhoods Department

- Animal Care and Protective Services charges many regulatory fees that are structured to promote responsible animal ownership and provide public safety regarding dangerous animals.
- Regulatory fees in this department vary widely from those which cover a portion of variable costs to those which cover all variable and fixed costs plus contribute to shortfalls in other related fees.

Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department

- Controlled Access fees are in place to be govern demand and recoup variable costs for numerous parks and facilities. Market studies could be performed for some fees and consideration given to weighing price differentials for out of county residents however proof of residency administrative burden and visitor entrance logistics would have to be weighed. The differential could favor county residents who provide operational and capital funding through their taxes while controlling demand.
 Overtime Reimbursements cover the cost of events at various park facilities.
 The various tennis lesson fees cover the overall costs of tennis pro's time.
- Huguenot Park Enterprise the current budget requires a General Fund contribution of over \$350,000 to balance its budget of over \$940,000. The park is experiencing increased activity which may reduce future contributions.
- Hanna Park Enterprise is covering operating and capital costs.
- Fees for the former Sports and Entertainment Department will be moved into Parks & Rec per ORD 2019-395-E.

Planning and Development Department

- Regulatory fees in this department vary widely from those which cover a portion of variable costs to those which cover all variable and fixed costs plus contribute to shortfalls in other related fees.
- The Concurrency Management fund balances its budget by fund balance transfers since the implementation of ORD 2015-249-E which changed the allocation of various fees.
 The 2020/21 budget appropriates remaining fund balance. An alternate revenue source of approximately \$400,000 may be needed to balance the 2021/22 budget.
- The Building Inspection Fund, which includes Planning & Development and Fire & Rescue inspections was found to cover its expenditures in the October 1 review. The Legislature recently enacted new building inspection timelines which may affect future service delivery. The Council's Special Committee on Assessing the City's Building and Development Permitting Processes is reviewing this function

Public Works Department

- Regulatory fees in this department vary widely from those which cover a portion of variable costs to those which cover all variable and fixed costs plus contribute to shortfalls in other related fees.
- The current Solid Waste Disposal Enterprise budget includes a net operating loan of \$6,420,340 from the General Fund.
 Resolution 2020-696-D regarding non-ad valorem assessments for residential collection fees levied by this fund was denied by the Council in December.
- The Stormwater Utility Enterprise was found to cover its expenditures and capital funding requirements in the October 1 review.

Duval County Health Department

Health services are provided on a sliding fee scale by this State agency. Local government concurrence is required for some rate changes. Most fees have not been adjusted since 2010. The department is preparing proposed legislation for a potential increase in certain areas to better align costs with services provided to county residents.

Jacksonville Public Library

The Board of Library Trustees is not referenced in §123.102 establishing the City fee webpage. Pursuant to §662.104 the Board may charge and collect fees. The agency provides a link in the City's webpage to their site for public information. Accordingly, we do not present a fee analysis but make the following statement for information.

- Controlled Access fees of \$25 per calendar quarter are charged for out of county residents.
- Regulatory fee structure includes overdue fines and lost material replacement costs.
- Conference Facility enterprise fees have covered operating costs and capital needs until
 the pandemic. Rentals have diminished considerably, as a result fund balance has
 diminished.

Tax Collector

This elected official is not referenced in §123.102 establishing the City fee webpage. The office provides a link to their business tax calculation site for public information. The tax is established by other legislation and is not a service fee.

Jacksonville Sheriff's Office

This elected official is not referenced in §123.102 establishing the City fee webpage. Municipal Code §37.111 establishes the Sheriff's separate fee webpage with the authority to set fees. The agency provides a link in the City's webpage to their site for public information. Accordingly, we do not present a fee analysis but make the following statement for information.

The Sheriff's Office levies several regulatory fees governing public records, inmate services, prisoner supervision, adult entertainment oversight, sexual offender registration, alarm services and vehicle towing services. The fees are governed by Statutes or local laws and have evolved to provide varying levels of cost coverage like other regulatory fees.

Summary

The attached Fee Review Summarization Worksheet presents the City fee webpage listings for the fees covered in this review and incremental costs where calculable. As mentioned above, most City fees are not levied to recoup all the costs of providing a public service and the cost of many services cannot be determined with a level of precision to make finite pricing decisions. We make no recommendations for rate changes due to this pricing policy along with the recent elimination of administrative control over rate setting by Ordinance 2020-557-E and the denial of proposed Resolution 2020-696.

Rates for Stormwater Management Service - Section 754.106

The Stormwater Utility Enterprise was found to cover its expenditures and capital funding requirements in the October 1 review.

There will be a charge for all Owners of real property in the City covered by this ordinance, who have improvements or uses thereon which contribute stormwater runoff to the city's stormwater management system, a monthly stormwater service charge. The basic stormwater service charge shall be \$5 per month per SFU, or \$60 per year per SFU, as follows:
