We are in receipt of your email dated October 9, 2019.

While your email purports to protest "the rejection of of [sic] the New Solution for Business (NSB) community collaboative [sic] submittal," such a protest is not proper at this time in the procurement process. All protests concerning Invitation to Negotiate #127-19 for Strategic Alternatives (the "ITN") are governed by section 2.14 of the ITN and section 5-101 of the JEA Procurement Code.

Any protest relating to the terms of the solicitation (including the sufficiency of the information contained within the solicitation) is now untimely pursuant to the terms of those provisions. By contrast, any protest relating to the evaluation, negotiation, or award processes would be premature at this time.
