Thanks for making this email available for public comments.

I think it's very clear where much of the map needs work.

There are several neighborhoods in District 9 that have no reason to be lumped together into a single district except to discount the black voters in the north of the district.

The same can be said for parts of Districts 10 and 14.

It makes much more sense, and I would argue all of Jacksonville would agree, to have the portions of Districts 9 and 14 north of the Cedar and Ortega rivers combined into 1 district (New District A), and the parts below those rivers combined into another (New District B).

Along those same lines, it probably makes more sense to include some of the downtown portions of Districts 7 and 8 in this New District A, splitting somewhere between Broad St and Main St.

I don't know why it makes any sense to include the entire north side in with the downtown section of District 7. That seems to me like something that should be split around the Trout river with the portions of Districts 7 and 8 north of the Trout river combining into one district and the portions south either combining into one or staying separate as two districts based on population.

District 5 should probably be cut off at Philips Hwy and the parts east of it included within Districts 1 or 4. District 5 should also only extend as far south as University or at most, Baymeadows. Everything below that should be part of District 6.

I think much of the rest of the map is mostly fine but I am not as well acquainted with the rest of the city as these parts discussed above.

I offer the following personal comments on the re-districting process:

- 1. <u>Beaches CD 13</u>: The 3 beaches cities (Atlantic Beach, Neptune Beach, Jacksonville Beach) which each individually have their own local City government, own comprehensive plan, own land development regulations/zoning code, and own Mayor should continue to be together in a council district in COJ (AKA county/consolidated)
- 2. <u>San Pablo Road North neighborhood north of Atlantic</u>: Residences on both east and west sides of dead-ended San Pablo Road North should be together in the same council district.

Whether in Beaches CD 13, a west of intracoastal CD 3 or a revised CD 2 returning to a more "Greater Arlington±" formed version of CD 2 (i.e., if similar to a decades ago earlier grouping of CD 2 in PD 2, but NOT if CD 2 is grouped north), the residences of the short San Pablo Rd North should remain together, as they all have San Pablo Rd North as their only entrance and exit. The residences with driveways directly on SPRN and the Pablo Point & Pablo Oaks subdivisions have for decades functioned as a community, with gated Waterside more recently established --through rezoning from rural --as a cut through subdivision also using San Pablo Rd N via the Pablo Point subdivision.

- 3. <u>Planning Districts Issue:</u> Prior Council redistricting & the one now challenged divided neighborhoods within the 6 COJ (non beaches) Planning Districts and has interfered with cohesiveness & implementation of the Vision Plans of those Planning Districts. (e.g., CD 1,2,3 were together traditionally Greater Arlington/West intracoastal; there was a defined North Planning District, and a defined Westside Planning District) Council Members no longer serve a definite Planning District with its Vision Plan, but, instead, often have constituents in multiple Planning Districts.
- 4. <u>CD 2:</u> Both in the former redistricting and again in the most recent. ersion as before the court, CD 2 strikes me as an odd grouping. CD 2 was once one of the 3 basic council districts of the Greater Arlington Planning District 2, neighborhoods that identified together, visioned together, etc. While I see East Arlington, Fort Caroline Shores, Gately Oaks, Cobblestone, Holly Oaks as a grouping, the overall district identity is unclear to me.

I have no comments on redistricting related to race or political party.




