Thank you for taking the time to thoroughly review the proposed redistricting maps for Jacksonville. This is an extremely important role and we appreciate your thoughtfulness. We understand draft council maps MAROON and LIME are moving forward to be edited by the Committee today. With this process moving as quickly as it is, RAP wishes to make its position very clear.

Riverside and Avondale are adjacent historic neighborhoods that share a Historic Designation within the City of Jacksonville Planning Department. This overlay on our district has implications for nearly every department within the City and it has been invaluable to have a Councilperson who understands this distinction and has the expertise to navigate the City for their constituents.

As you continue to deliberate Jacksonville's redistricting, **we strongly request and ask that you retain Riverside and Avondale in one Council District. We are one neighborhood.** The map of our district is available on our homepage at RiversideAvondale.org.

As of November 1, the LIME map divides the commercial section of Riverside including the Riverside Arts Market, 5 Points, Memorial Park and more from the remainder of our community. The MAROON map divides our neighborhood into 3 parts with sections going north, west, and south. It is our intention to remain with neighborhoods that have similar infrastructure demands and community concerns, such as Murray Hill, Ortega, North Riverside and beyond.

RAP is determined to be involved in the redistricting process, and we ask that you consider our unique status and overarching concerns.

Dear Commissioners.

There are many reasons to keep city commission representation of the Riverside Avondale Historic District under one city commissioner. Here are are few key reasons it is imperative for you to maintain the continuity of the Riverside Avondale Historic District in your final voting district map:

1) Economic Development

The Riverside Avondale Historic District is home to mostly locally-owned businesses with many of those owners living inside the district. These businesses rely both on residents of the district and people coming to the district to have a unique experience to be their customers. Many of you have traveled to cities where entrepreneurial imagination and community support created or enhanced destination environments and unique places. These are cities, large and small, where citizens, and their government, identified and defined their culture or distinctive amenities to create an ambience attracting visitors who desired to experience something different than what is offered where they live. The Riverside Avondale Historic District provides that experience for people. Keeping the Riverside Avondale Historic District under one representative commissioner allows that commissioner to focus on the needs of the business community.

2) Property Value Security

The Riverside Avondale Historic District attracts people who enjoy living in a historic community. With that comes the understanding that they are stewards of Jacksonville's history. As evidenced by the continued updating of our historic architectural gifts from the past by current residents, Jacksonville is able to promote the community to future residents. Under one representative commissioner the historic district is best able to prioritize government infrastructure needs.

3) Enhancing Civic Pride and Tourism

My wife and I just completed a four month tour of the West and Northwest in our RV. All totaled we stopped in 39 locations stretching between Jacksonville and Vancouver. We, along with our fellow tourists, were mostly looking for the same thing during our travels, the ability to immerse ourselves in nature, our shared national history and local food experiences. Redistricting Committee:

I read in a news report that there is a perception that there are no official neighborhood maps to go by in redistricting.

Here are two maps which clearly define the Riverside Avondale Neighborhood:

1. Riverside Avondale Zoning Overlay, legislation passed unanimously by the City Council in 2008. The different colors represent different character and zoning standards.
2. Riverside Avondale Historic District established in 1998. The Historic Preservation Commission reviews COAs within the Historic District (and with Springfield's and Downtowns.)

The Riverside Avondale Preservation neighborhood association has been active since 1974.

The city needs to keep the Riverside and Avondale combined neighborhoods together in one Council District. This neighborhood is one of the most vibrant, diverse and thriving neighborhoods in the city.

NOTE: Springfield also has a Historic District and a Zoning Overlay. San Marco has a Zoning Overlay and other neighborhoods do too.

P.S. I suggest that CPAC boundaries should follow the districts, not the other way around.
