Hello,

I attended the special committee meeting today, Nov 3 2022, regarding redistricting. I offer the following thoughts for your consideration:

**The city council should eliminate the optional, arbitrary policy of shaping the districts on the basis of the incumbents' residences.**

- 1) The people of Jacksonville and its communities should be the key factors shaping the district maps – not incumbency. The rationale is clear: District maps are required to be redrawn every 10 years in order to reflect the new census data. Census data is based on people. The district maps should also be based on people. Incumbency should not be the driving force.
- 2) As pointed out by City Council VP Salem, it is problematic (and possibly illegal?) to shape the districts primarily on the basis of incumbents' residences without extending the same to all existing qualified candidates (running for office in the "old" districts). Moreover, it seems very wrong to accommodate some qualified candidates but not others.
- 3) Incumbents are tied to the "old districts" which have been deemed unfit by a judge. Using incumbents as a basis for the maps ties us to that same status quo and potentially doesn't fix the underlying problems noted by the judge.

**The Unity map is our best option and should be the basis of the City Council's proposals moving forward.**

**The Maroon map needs a lot of work (and preferably should be scrapped).**

- 1) The bizarre district shapes of District 14 and 7 need to be fixed. Our ordinance code requires our districts to be logical and compact.
- 2) The motions passed today need to be accommodated.
- 3) With its shape being driven by incumbency (e.g. status quo), the city council very much needs to prove that the Maroon map isn't again "packing" black voters together. We need to see the demographic numbers.
- 4) In line with the City of Jacksonville overall, roughly the same number of districts should be dominated by Republicans vs Democrats.

To the Council,

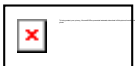
