Alumni House	<ul> <li>ALL APPLICANTS AND RESIDENTS:         <ul> <li>Requirement to wear mask, maintain appropriate social distance, and otherwise comply with house rules</li> <li>Persons with ESSENTIAL EMPLOYMENT documentation are housed in a separate "High Risk Room" isolated from other residents. All staff and all residents are required to be masked and maintain social distance (and gloved when appropriate) when in common areas or dealing with others.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Persons prohibited from work and without other income are not being charged for rent during this crisis.
